FAIR PLAY FOR THE MARITIME PROVINCES

No Better Than the Rest of
Canada, but Just as Good—
Serious Times Ahead
for Country.

Mr. H. J. Logan, ex-M. P. for Cumberland, N. S., was one of the principal speakers at the recent Maritime Board of Trade convention at Moncton. The Transcript gives the following report of his remarks:

Mr. Logan said that he had attended meetings in the various towns all through the three provinces. "We are not any better than the rest of Canada, but we insist that we are just as good," Mr. Logan declared. "We are playing a part in the history of Canada today. This is the century of Canada, blessed as we are with great potentialities, such great resources. Today is the resurrection of this Maritime Board of Trade and we all recognize the fact that we have interests peculiarly our own. Years ago we had our greatest statesmen advocating the coming together of the Canadian provinces. Confederation has in some respects been a failure to the Maritime Provinces, but generally speaking we still do not wish to be

Mr. Logan briefly referred to the past differences in the ranks of Maritime Province members, of the rivalry between the different sections of the province by the sea, and said that on the last occasion the Maritime delegation visited Ottawa they found the Maritime members united for the first time. The rivalry between St. John and Halifax was a joke at Ottawa.

"There are serious times ahead in Canada," declared the speaker, "None of us are pessimists, but still we must face the facts. We must endeavor to solve our problems, remembering first of all we are Canadians one and all. Canada means more to us now than ever before. Our boys fought that we in this country might be free. They fought the good fight and won against the menace of German militarism. We are intensely in love with this our country—Canada. Whether we spring from the race that gave to the world a gallant Wolfe or a chivalrous Montcalm, we are Canadians, first of all. We in the Maritime Provinces do not wish to be sectional, but always remembering that when we build up the Maritime Provinces we are building up Canada. We may travel far and wide, but we come back realizing there is no place like our home down by the sea. We have wonderful harbors, splendid rivers, growing forests and rich mines and all we need is harmonious effort."

Mr. Logan hoped that the next meeting would be held in Amherst and promised a three times greater delegation from Nova Scotia to the meeting next year.
