

Satin a Favorite.

Those camisole tops with the ribbon shoulder straps are not the most satisfactory thing in the world either for comfort or modesty. RANDOM REMINDERS.

Especially in damp weather, during the summer, cane chair seats are apt to sag, and particularly if they are old. To help overcome this, turn the chair upside down, spread a wet cloth over the inverted seat, press it neatly over the cane and allow it to remain until all is perfectly dry. Do not wait until the sagging is bad; nip it in the bud.

If your steel knives become discolored, use a cut potato or a large cork to apply the cleaning agent.

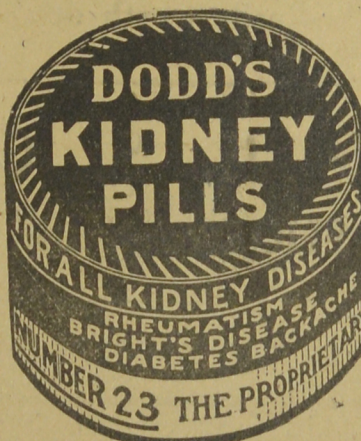
When the juice is extracted from lemons, do not throw the skins away immediately; instead, dip them in salt and use the same for cleaning faucets; they polish brass quickly.

Next time you serve patties, sweet or meat style, roll the crust thin, invert your gem pans, grease well, then cover with crust, stick with a fork, bake quickly, remove from the moulds and behold lovely patty shells."

For cracks in floors make a paste of half pound of flour, 3 quarts of water, half a pound of alum; mix thoroughly and boil; soak newspapers in the paste until the mixture is about as thick as putty; force into the cracks with case knife; it will harden like papier mache.

Cement for china and glass: Stir plaster of paris into a thick solution of gum arabic until it is the thickness of cream. Apply to the broken edges of china and join together, let stand for three days and they can never be broken in the same place.
