## INSPECTORS NOT WELCOME AT POLICE STATION

**NO LONGER PERMITTED TO QUESTION PRISONERS**

Complete Separation of Work of City Police and Liquor Inspectors—Salary Question.

The change in the performance of double duties of Liquor Inspector and Chief of Police by Chief W. H. Finley of the Frederickton Police, whereby he ceased to be liquor sub-inspector for this city and adjoining territory has brought about changes at the police station. Liquor sub-inspectors who formerly used the police station as headquarters while in Frederickton have been informed that the practice must be discontinued and that they must secure other quarters and use some other telephone. The sub-inspectors already are acting on the new system.

Questioning of Prisoners Stopped Interrogation of prisoners by liquor sub-inspectors also has been stopped by Chief Finley and Chairman William McKay of the Police Commission states that this was done with the knowledge and consent of the Commission. Henceforth prisoners held at the police station may be interrogated only on an order from the Chief of Police. This will result in greater difficulty in securing information on the part of the sub-inspectors.

### Salary Question Not Dealt With

Chairman McKay stated this morning that the matter of the salary of Chief Finley had not yet been discussed by the Police Commission. As a result of not performing duties as liquor sub-inspector, the annual salary of the Chief now is \$1,200 per annum. He also receives \$100 as truant officer. The total salaries formerly were \$1600.
