## N. B. BABES IN THE WOOD

A touching but sad story of childish devotion came from New Brunswick at the end of November, 1868. She then went to the beach, gathered up a quantity of seaweed and carried it carefully back to the sleeping children to still more warmly cover them, laying some loose boughs, broken from the bushes, over the seaweed to keep it from being blown away.

When the searchers, who had been hunting all night for the missing children, finally discovered them in the early morning, the little sleepers were found warm and well beneath their carefully prepared covering, while a few yards away were found the remains of the six-year-old martyr who had mothered the little ones at the expense of her own life.

## GIRLS TRAINING FOR Y. M. C. A. WORK OVERSEAS ARE GOOD DANCERS

Special Course Established at Barnard College for Intensive Training Includes Endurance Dancing, and the Girls Must Learn Canteen Cookery and How to Lead to Group Games—Instruction in Hygiene Also Given.

Dancing is the one course which is not taught to the hundreds of young women from all over the country who gather each week at Barnard College to take the intensive training for Y. M. C. A. overseas workers. The course is eliminated because every girl accepted usually is a skillful dancer.

Endurance dancing, however, has to be developed as the ratio of soldiers who want to dance in the "Y" huts is anywhere from 100 to 1,000 to 1 girl. In addition the girl must learn to lead in group games. From this, it can be understood that waiting on tables, "shooting biscuits," is not the entire sum of canteen work in France. Food of course never can be considered a side line where American soldiers take their appetites, but there are other needs to be considered.

Recognizing this, the Y. M. C. A. has established a special course at Barnard College for girls going overseas and canteen cookery is but one of the dozen or more subjects in which the Red Triangle girls receive instruction. The course, "The Barnard Conference" lasts one week, and is directed by Miss Helen Miller and an advisory committee headed by Dean Virginia C. Gildersleeve of Barnard.

From All Over Land

The girls recruited in every section of the country, come to New York to take this course after they have been

accepted for service abroad. During their stay they are quartered at Fernald Hall a Barnard dormitory, and all expenses are met by the Y. M. C. A.

A new group of girls start the course each Wednesday. Those who have some knowledge of French are "brushed up" in the language by means of French conversation, and those who have never studied the subject are launched upon it before being sent abroad to cope with the friendly but exceedingly unintelligible French people.

Instruction in hygiene designed to teach the workers how to keep fit for service under difficult conditions is also emphasized. In connection with this work the girls are put through very strenuous setting up drills—almost as thorough as the dreaded "spring medicine" which West Pointers must endure. Those who are too delicate to thrive on this physical training are eliminated, for canteen work has been called "a man's size job for a woman to tackle."

Stunts of the parlor variety—singing, reading, reciting, story telling, magic, and the playing of any musical instruments, from a jewsharp to a grand piano, are also encouraged, frequently the girls are given an opportunity to try out their parlor tricks on an audience of "Y" secretaries.

## WHY BELGIANS STILL NEED HELP

"In travelling through Belgium with the Belgian armies, I have been able to see the country recently tenanted by the Bochs in the condition in which they left it, and never was there such desolation anywhere. One cannot get away from signs of destruction, no matter where one goes, along the country roads or in the city streets.

Not only has property been destroyed and every means of livelihood taken away from the people, but the peasants, especially in the country districts, have been left destitute both of home and food. We travelled twelve miles yesterday through open country and as but one small instance of the vast plundering of the Germans, let me state that in all twelve miles not one solitary live animal did we see, and practically every tree had been felled, so you can imagine the dreary aspect of the scenery.

All the peasant women and children we met on our way, said a news correspondent, while they greeted us with cheers and received us into their homes with open arms, those that had homes, showed the greatest suffering from insufficient food and nourishment. They did not complain, but merely stated as a fact that they had not tasted meat for two months and had lived largely on soup and coffee.

The cry of the Belgians today is for food and clothing and those who would help, no matter how little, should send their contributions to their committee, or direct to the Central Committee, Belgian Relief Fund, 59 St. Peter street, Montreal.

Now, answer truthfully and shame Old Nick and his side partner, Kaiser Bill. How about those good resolutions adopted so enthusiastically over a week ago?

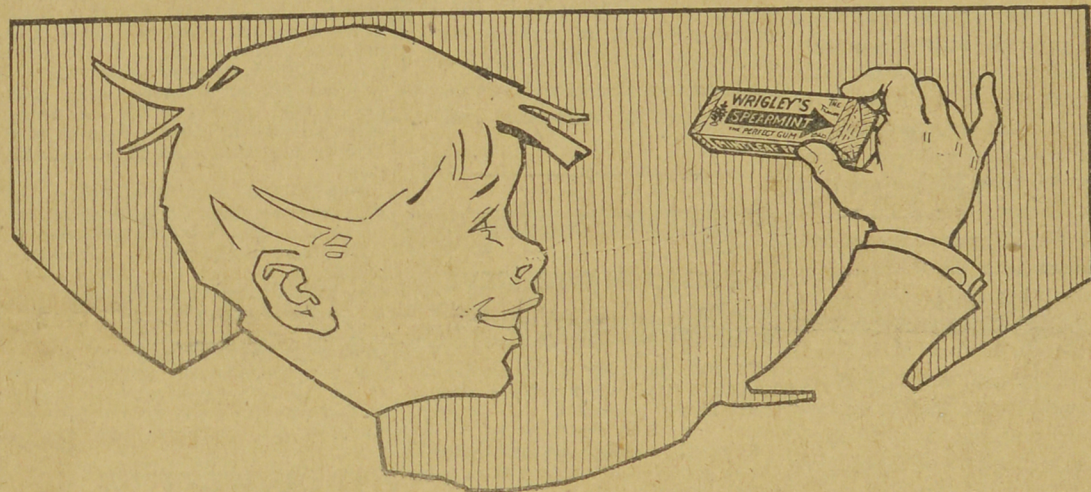

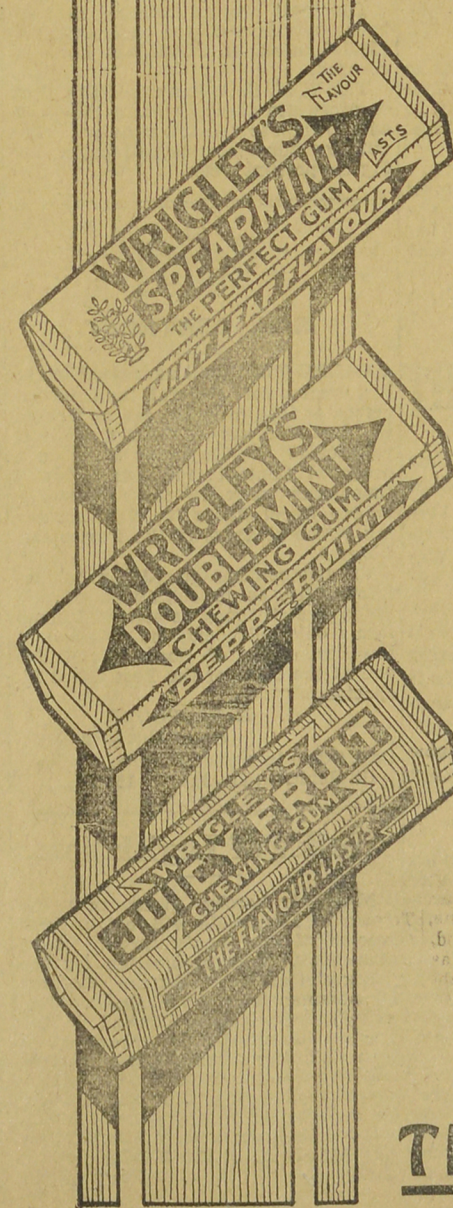
