MAYOR'S VOTE WILL KEEP MAXIMUM AT \$60,000

Tied Vote of the City Council Showed That There is Feeling Against Increasing School Expenditures—Amendment of Ald. Wilkinson was to Reduce the Maximum to \$55,000—Several Annual Reports of Departmental Superintendents Were Presented to the Council.

That there is a feeling among the members of the City Council that the greatly increased expenditure of the School Board is not entirely agreeable to the ratepayers was shown at last night's meeting of the City Council when it was only by the casting vote of the Mayor that the memorial praying the legislature to increase the maximum for school assessment in Fredericton to \$60,000, was passed with the amount as named and not reduced to \$55,000. Ald. McKay and Ald. Burpee were the absentees and Ald. McKay previously expressed an opinion against the increase to the figure named. The argument was advanced that the School Board did not need the maximum of \$60,000 and that to place it at such a figure would be merely encouraging extravagance.

A number of annual reports were presented by various superintendents

Street Lighting

The report of Supt. Davidson of the Street Lighting Department stated that the plant was in good operating condition. The lines are good but new poles are needed. Among the necessities of the plant are repairs to the roof, and new boiler room and coal shed. Further replacement of arc lamps could be made at a cost of \$550.

Water Department

Foreman George Edney of the Water Department in his report stated that the new mains had been laid as follows: Westmorland street, 775 feet; Victoria street, 655 feet; Donald street, 254 feet. Hydrants in

the city number 120. During the year twenty one services were laid and fourteen were relaid making a total of 1,433 services in the city. Meters installed numbered 377 of which 45 had been installed during the year. It was recommended that more meters be installed. Two new gates were installed during the year making a total of 174. More renewals of gates were recommended.

In regard to meters Ald. Shea chairman of the Water Committee recommended a continuance of the policy of installing meters until the entire city is metered. It was the only method of eliminating waterwaste.

Sewerage Department

For the Sewerage Department Supt. Edney reported that 244 feet of new mains had been constructed also one new man-hole. The mains had been flushed twice during the year. For eight days the operation of the sewerage pumps had been necessary. To date 1,284 services had been laid. Repairs for the sewerage-pumps were recommended.

Pumping Station

Chief Engineer John J. Malloy of the Pumping Station reported upon the condition of the plant and the quantity of water pumped. He recommended a new pump in place of the Holly and made a number of other recommendations in connection with the plant. Ald. Shea pointed out in this connection that during the year no outside help had been employed to make repairs the engineers doing it all themselves.

Tax Collections

Ald. Reid reported on tax collections as follows: December, 1917, \$1,207.12. December, 1918, \$1,771.21.

Municipal Home

Ald. Baxter reporting for the Municipal Home Committee, stated that there had been a total expenditure of \$492.75 during the month.

A cheque for \$75 was ordered to issue in favor of William Hughes tax-collector on account of his salary.

School Assessment

from \$40,000 to \$60,000 was presented.

Ald. Wilkinson objected that an increase of fifty per cent was too great. It always had been his experience that a public body with a certain sum of money at its disposal very soon reached its limit in expenditure. A maximum of \$60,000 would simply encourage another salary raid by the teachers.

He came to the City Council as an alderman when the total school assessment was only \$22,000. Personally he believed that \$55,000 was sufficient as a maximum.

Mayor Hanson said it would be practically the same thing as the School Board would be right back for a further increase.

Ald. Reid expressed the opinion that what was wanted was men on the School Board with sufficient backbone to tell the teachers if they were not worth more salary to go get a new job. There was too much "passing the buck".

Tie Vote

Ald. Reid moved that the memorial be endorsed by the City Council.

Ald. Walker seconded the motion. The increase seemed large but he believed that the School Board would expend the appropriation with a due regard to economy.

Ald. Wilkinson seconded by Ald. Baxter moved an amendment that the maximum amount for School assessment be \$55,000 instead of \$60,000.

The vote on the amendment to reduce the amount was tied as follows: Yea—Baxter, Cooper, Barker, Wilkinson.

Nay—Walker, Reid, Davidson, Shea. Mayor Hanson cast his vote for the original motion. Dollars and cents he said was not a fair standard by which to judge education. Fredericton must keep up its standard of primary education. Further there was the matter of technical or vocational education. He believed that a substantial expenditure on a new school building was contemplated that building to be used for a technical school and high school. The amendment however, had the merit of drawing the attention of the School Board to the fact that it was amenable to the City Council in this particular.
