A world record for destroyer construction was made, the secretary said in the building of the Reid at Squantum, Mass, ic corty-five working days.

Discussing the proposed radical departure in the training of officers for the navy, Mr. Daniel declared that "no officer can command so well as the man of ability and knowledge who knows every character of service from polishing brass to the highest strategy and tactics." He added that a year's training as an enlisted man would prove invaluable to every officer and that heretofore commissioned officers had no actual seagoing training in the duties of enlisted men except an incidental knowledge acquired during short summer cruises.
