Fight for the Fair Millions—Stokes
Divorce Suit—Tragic Deaths the
Rule in Cheap Family.

Mrs. Tessie Oelrichs, who with her sister, Mrs. William K. Vanderbilt, Jr., have a real fight on hand in the revived contest over the Fair millions now before the California courts in preliminary stages, has decided to remain in France for the winter. She is having a fine time, quite unbothered by anything for the first time in five years.

Mrs. W. E. D. Stokes, the present, now in Denver, Col., was last week awarded temporary custody of her children. The final hearing will be on Jan. 8 and the decision then will have bearing on the divorce suit of the aged New York multi-millionaire who in his divorce bill names his son who has produced what purports to be a confession.

Mrs. Maud Mary Cheape the famous huntress and wealthy society woman, mother of the international polo player, Capt. Leslie Cheape, died lately after five years of tragedy. Her father, Richard Hemming, made millions in needles and left the estate to her. Five years ago her eldest daughter was drowned when the Empress of Ireland sank in the St. Lawrence; soon afterwards another daughter, bathing off Hull, England, was drowned. Her youngest son, Capt. Leslie who had played in international contests at New York, was killed in Egypt, during the war, and little more than a year ago her remaining son, Col. Hugo Cheape, returning from Egypt, went down when the Lisowen Castle was sunk.

Came the unmasking! Gee! A cullud puhson!! And a girl at that!! The discovery that Miss Rainbow is waitress at a favorite beerery hasn't tended to assuage the local tempest.

Clemenceau-Jacquemaire, the daughter of the premier of France, had a fine time in Springfield yesterday, when she was presented several pictures of her mother, who as Mary Plummer was well known here when she was wooed and won by Clemenceau. The pictures were the first the daughter ever had seen, showing her mother in girlhood and young womanhood, and she was deeply affected.

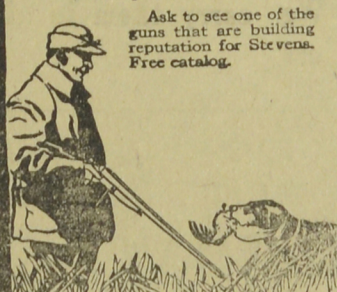

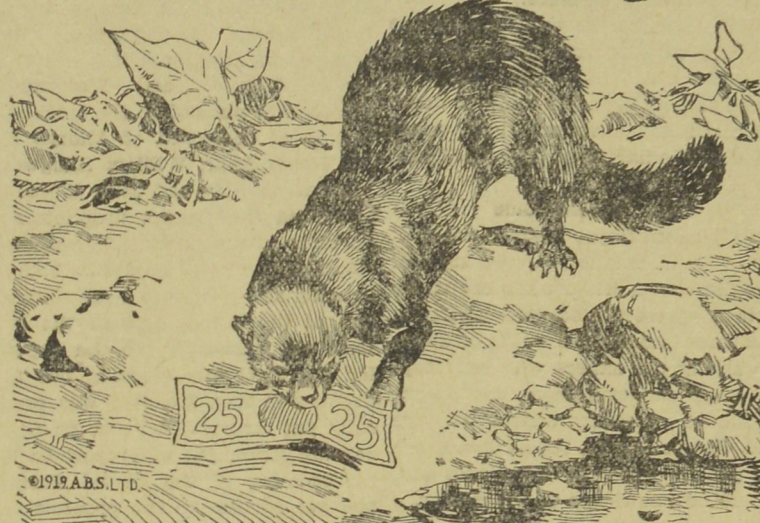
