

OF INTEREST TO WOMEN

PUDDING SAUCES.

One of the best sauces for puddings made with gelatin is a soft custard sauce and no cook should be without the recipe for such a sauce. Here is a good one. Heat two cups of milk with a half cup of sugar in a double boiler. Beat the yolks of three eggs, pour the hot milk over them, stirring slowly then return to the double boiler and cook carefully until thick. Add a pinch of salt and when cool add a teaspoon of butter and two egg whites beaten stiff and flavor with vanilla and serve

Lemon Sauce.

Mix together in a saucepan a tablesponful of corn starch and three-fourths of a cup of sugar. Stir in carefully one cup of boiling water, possibly more, as cornstarch varies in its thick ening qualities. Cook for ten minutes stirring often. Add the juice of one lemon and a little of the grated peel, and one tablespoonful of butter. Push back on the stove and as soon as the butter is all incorporated stir in quickly the beaten yolk of an egg. Beat the white very stiff, and stir in lightly so as to give the sauce the effect of foam.

LAUNDRY LORE.

The methods which bring snowy whiteness to muslin underwear bring ruination to silk underwear, and the laundress who does not understand this fact finds herself in a sorry fix on Monday night, Rubbing and boiling to muslin-must be avoided.

To wash silk mesh and crepe de chine underwear satisfactorily prepare a suds of pure soap and soft water, warm but not hot. If the water is naturally hard dissolve a little borax in it. Then knead the silk garments about in the suds with the hands until all the dirt is loosened. Put them in one piece at a time, as they are to be thoroughly cleaned.

If they are badly soiled they will need to be immersed in a second suds

After they are clean rinse them in two changes of clear lukewarm water and wring then gently dry. Hang them out of doors in the shade or else in the house in an open window where there is no sun. When they are almost dry iron them. If possible iron them with a piece of thin muslin between Sure! them and the fron. This method prevents a shiny gloss from coming on the silk.

Some persons find it better to let crepe de chine dry thoroughly and hen iron it on the wrong side

Crepe paper towels offer one means of lessening the work of the laundress in the summer, or, if the laundry is done out of the huose, of lessening the size of the laundry bill. The towels, of substantial thickness, are sold in packages of 100 for 50 cents. Granted that they can be used only a few times -sometimes only once-surely five of them would last as long as a freshly laundered huchaback towel; and the price charged in most laundries for washing and ironing a huchaback towel is 21/2 cents, the price of five paper towels. Moreover, the wear and tear which the huckaback towels would otherwise have is saved.


HOUSEHULD SCIENCE.




