The success of the campaign con-ducted by the National War Saving; Committee has been of a very striking character. After a discouraging start, when war saving was universally unpopular, the campagn succeeded beyond the highest expectations. On the 1st of January, 1919, there were in Great Britain over 2,000 War Savings committees, flourishing and active self governing bodies, so distributed that there was one within easy reach of every inhabitant. They supervised over 50,000 War Savings societies. The total number of War Savings Certificharacter.
