New York.—Parisian fashions are yielding to the influence of self-willed American womanhood, according to tidings of the neatest things in styles brought from France today by Miss Tobe Collier, expert on feminine prices and fur-below. Miss Tobe, who is buyer for one of the fashionable dress-making houses which sets fashions in America, came on the Steamer Cretic after two months in the French capital studying the new things in gowns, hats and shoes.

"Paris tried to introduce short skirts little more than knee length in America," she said. "The women of this country would not accept the style, and because of their refusal to do so the style for Paris itself has swung back to moderately long skirts, at least the very short once have been abandoned by all save women of the vulgar type. A skirt reaching to within nine inches of the ground is now regarded as the proper thing."

Miss Collier, the picture of smart attire, as she waited for the custom officials to put official marks on a formidable array of bags and trunks on the pier, said her own dress of black charmeuse complied with the nine inch skirt rule. It was scantily ruffled and she wore a Robespierre collar and semi-Napoleonic hat of black velvet. The sleeves were elbow length and she wore a chantille veil. Ostrich feathers are no longer in vogue in Paris, she explained, and neither are full hip skirts. Long vamp shoes are being fore there and in that followers of the proper thing in dress are taking their cue from America. In the same way the fashionable dress-making establishments talk in terms of dollar and cents now instead of francs. Also to go American ways one better the modistes are introducing the "American pep" by reason of which it is possible to have a \$200 gown turned out in one or two days instead of three, four or five weeks as it used to be.

The influence of American ways and American whims as to fashion is a dominant thing in Paris. Miss Tobe Collier assured with a smile of satisfaction.

## HOUSEHOLD HINTS.

Apples, bananas and lettuce make a good salad mixture.

Muffin and cake batters require half as much liquid as flour.

Some form of salad should go with any kind of hot chicken.

Knitted underwear is a great saving as it needs no laundering.

It is an excellent thing to see how little you can get along with.

Evaporated apples need lemon or spice to make an acceptable sauce.

Many flower holders are desirable for the household which loves flowers.

Orange gelatin served in the orange hull makes a most attractive dessert.

When the bottom of a cake is badly burned it may be grated off with a nutmeg grater.

## PEACH PIE.

For very sour peaches, use a breakfast cup of sugar to a small pie. Put half the sugar on the bottom crust. If the peaches are cut fine, simply pour them in; if cut in rather fine sections lay in on the sugar in nice order about two layers deep. Drop some lemon juice here and there. Put the other half of the sugar over the peaches, and, after wetting the edge of the bottom crust with water, and cutting a few slits in the upper crust put it on carefully and paste edge well with fingers, to bottom crust. Bake immediately from one-half to three-quarters of an hour, just nice and brown. The better baked the easier to digest.

## CARE OF UTENSILS.

Always rub the inside of any new utensil with mutton tallow or lard. Let this stand a day or two then gradually heat until the fat melts, and then wash with hot water and washing soda, which should be in the proportion of

a heaping tablespoonful to a quart of water.

Use a dish mop or a fork to hold the cloth. Rinse the utensil in hot water and wipe dry with a clean towel, rubbing it very hard.

Another good method of preparing new iron kettles and spiders for use is to boil potato parings in them for several hours, then scald and wash.

When using ironware put it to soak as soon as emptied; then have clean, hot water and wash the inside and outside carefully, rinse in hot water and wipe dry.

Moisture and acid cause rust, while soap and grease make smooth ware. For this reason many persons never

wash the griddle pan, but carefully wipe it each time after using with greased paper.

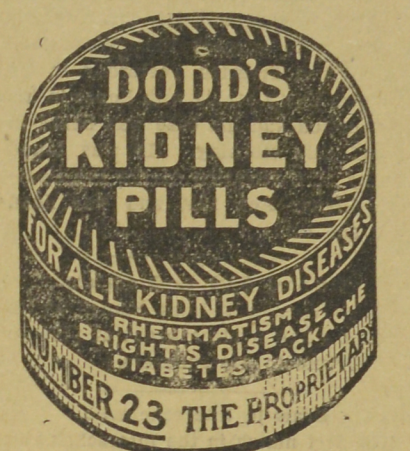


EXAMINATIONS FOR FOR-
