On the strength of this he received 500 francs and he started for Belgium where he was arrested by the Germans and sentenced at Antwerp to six weeks in prison.

Miss Cavell Arrested

The arrest was a ruse. On July 28 Miss Cavell was seized and later her frends including the Princess de Croy and Mdlle. Thulliez also were arrested Their fate is a matter of well known

As for Quien, a Brussels prison sav him next, and then in Switzerland he resumed underground work for the Germans. At last returning to France he was taken for felonies committee before the war and the present charges were brought.

The trial, if proceeded with, prom ises to furnish Paris with many sen sations. The list of witnesses includes notable names, that of Brand Whit lock, American minister to Belgium being among them.
