

Popular Plaid Combinations Are Noted in the Stores of New York.

New York, Aug. 31.—Plaids seem to be big everywhere for skirts. Some of the most seen combinations are orange and brown, brown and tan, green and garnet, dragon fly and orange, sapphire, brown and tan, oxford, garnet and royal blue.

Accordion pleated skirts are among the most popular seen. Almost all purchasers of separate skirts are taking them up.

Brocaded and plaid satins are among the favored silks for separate skirts.

Tricollettes woven with dashes or glints of color are made into simple shirred skirts.

Monkey fur is gaining rapidly in use for all sorts of hat models.

Goat fringe and bear fringe are used freely on some millinery.

Willow ostrich is made into long tassels by the French and used in hat trimmings.

Painted leather is used by Jeanne Duc on his new millinery models.

Painted leather flowers and all sorts of ornaments are seen in a wide variety of fancies in millinery decoration.

Very short gowns featuring side width, are among the radical style departures in undergarments. They are frequently developed in attractive designs borrowed from dress ideas.

Continued insistence is noted on hand-made touches and suggestions of hand work on the better grades of silk undergarments.

The New Blouses.

The shops are really alluring in their display of the new over-blouses in fabrics and styles suitable for summer wear. It is perhaps an interesting thing that wash fabrics have been made to serve so admirably for these blouses—for there was a time when it seemed that only chiffon and georgette and soft crepe would do for them.

But now, linen, organdie, batiste, raiine—lots of raiine, too, which is another of those interesting evidences of a return to favor of a fabric or style that has seemingly gone by—all these and other summer fabrics, heavy, homespun, crashlike looking things, are used for the over-blouse.

One thing that marks many of the blouses is little tassels and hanging buttons and fringe. There are all sorts of these pendant decorations, from sleeve ends and hems and just hanging down from any other part of the blouse itself.

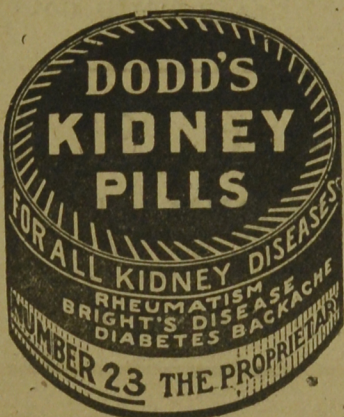
A HOT KNIFE.

When there is fresh bread to be sliced heat the bread knife a moment on the top of the stove and you will find it slips through the soft fresh loaf easily. Reheat before cutting each slice.

Packed butter can be cut into neat, even squares or slabs for table use if the knife is dipped in hot water each time before cutting through the butter. When butter is cut with a cold, dry knife it adheres to the knife blade and makes ragged edges on what should be perfectly trim, smooth sections.

TWO KITCHEN REQUISITES.

The kitchen should never be without concentrated lye and washing soda. The lye ought to be used once a week to clear away the grease collected on the inside of the waste pipe of the sink. Dissolve the lye in boiling water and pour down the pipe while it is very hot. Washing soda may also be used for the same purpose, as well as for cleaning pots and kettles. Fill your utensils with hot water and set over the fire with a teaspoonful of soda.

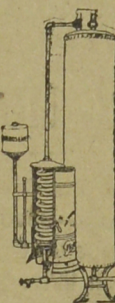
