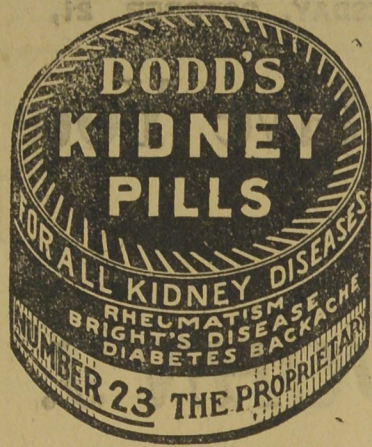

operative must have worked at least 92½ per cent of the full working time during the three months payment period.

"A portion of the machinery is as at present stated at present standing idle and producing nothing, due to either a shortage of operatives or to their absence from work. The management believes that, with the help and co-operation through regular attendance; by discouraging the absence from work of their fellow-workers and sometimes by inducing a friend to take up work in the mill if there are openings available. The increase in product that would result from such a condition can be readily imagined, and also the consequent benefit to the workers and



to the company under this sharing plan.

Please give all this your very earnest thought. Let us all pull together and there need be no fears as to the results.

In discussing this plan with "The Financial Post," Mr. Dawson pointed out that it was decided to bring it into operation in the fall, rather than in the spring or summer, as the tendency would be all to the advantage of the workers in more regularity and attention to work than is usual in the summer.

On the general principle Mr. Dawson earnestly believes in the obligation of the employer to give the workmen all the advantages possible, and as great a share as is practicable in the earnings of the plant. This would be the most effective method of pro-

viding them with the means to meet higher costs of maintaining themselves under present-day conditions. One of the interesting points is that these shares in profits are paid quarterly, just when the shareholders receive theirs and if the money is left on deposit it will receive 6 per cent interest—the exact amount paid the shareholders, and if this is raised to 7 or 8 per cent later on the operatives will benefit in an interest rate to the same extent.

PRESS COMMENT ON THE ELECTION IN ONTARIO

Toronto Globe Refers to Big
Overturn as a Political Revolution—Hearst Ministry Shattered.

Toronto, Ont., Oct. 20—The Mail and Empire chief supporting paper of the Ontario Conservative government publishes the following:

Standing of the new Ontario legislature:

Conservatives 26; Liberals 23; U. F. O., 43; Labor, 12; Independent 2. Total 111.

Toronto, Oct. 20—The Globe on Tuesday has two editorials, one under the title "A political revolution," saying in part:

Ontario is to have her first experience of coalitions. The King's government must be carried on. It is evident that the Hearst ministry, shattered and rent at the polls, and discredited before the country, cannot hope to receive from the United Farmers and the Labor members the co-operation and support necessary to its re-entering office. The verdict of the electors whatever else it may mean, does unquestionably mean that a majority of the people of Ontario are against the Hearst government and the desire that the "Seven Sleepers" shall be replaced by a live and progressive administration.

The defeat of five members of the cabinet is proof positive that outside of the question of the prohibition referendum and the liquor legislation the government had lasted out its welcome. The desire of the people for advancement and change is shown in many ways. The heavy gains made in industrial centres outside of the city by the Labor men is one. They carried both Hamiltons, London against such a dominant personality as Sir Adam Beck; Sault Ste. Marie against Sir William Hearst himself; St. Catharines South Waterloo, Fort William, beating Conservative opponents in all of these. In South Brant, another industrial community, the Labor candidate won against a Liberal.

Gains were made by the Liberals also in the industrial centres against the Conservative candidates. In Toronto

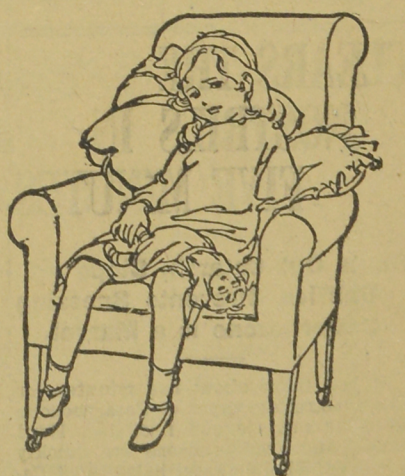
