MARITIME PROVINCE M.P.'S REGISTER A PROTEST

Object to Lavish Expenditure in Pleasure Resorts in the Wets While Public Services in the East are Starved — Housing Scheme for the Province of New Brunswick Meets with Approval — Rushing Work in the House.

Ottawa, June 25—When the interior estimates were up tonight the Maritime Province members objected to a large increase for this year when retrenchment was declared to be so necessary that money had been refused for necessary public works in the Maritime Provinces. J. H. Sinclair, Guysboro, said he had been unable to get the small sum of \$1,000 for a necessary breakwater in his county, while it was proposed to increase by \$146,000 the expenditure for building fancy roads through parks in Western Canada.

A. B. Copp, of Westmorland county said this was not the time to spend money on pleasure resorts, when we were facing a serious financial situation. He had asked for money for necessary public works in the Maritime Provinces and had been told there was no money in the treasury. The bulk of the money spent by tourists attracted to these parks went to the C. P. R.

Housing Scheme Opposed

Hon. N. W. Rowell, President of the Privy Council, today laid upon the table of the House an order-in-council approving of the general housing scheme of the province of New Brunswick. Advances of \$1,250,000 can there fore now be made in accordance with the government's housing scheme. Before the government gives its approval of a provincial scheme the latter comply with the federal government requirements as to maximum cost of dwellings, ownership of land and period of repayment.

Much Accomplished

The members of the commons made a concerted drive on the order paper of the house today, with the result that much business was accomplished. With corresponding headway during the next several days the objective of prorogation not later than Saturday July 5, will probably be achieved, despite the fact that the prime minister outlined a considerable programme of legislation still to be introduced. While prorogation a week from Saturday is aimed at, there is still thought to be some uncertainty about it, because the signing of peace anytime before that date might induce parliament to ratify the peace treaty before the house rises. The definite announcement by the prime minister that the federal franchise act will be introduced this session, coupled with the intimation that a number of bills now on the order paper are likely to go over strengthens the probability of an autumn session of the parliament.

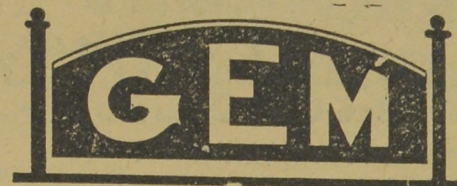
