

It is therefore a good idea to put all the ingredients and the mixing bowl and egg-beater in the ice box for a little while before using. Sometimes the only reason mayonnaise separates is because the beater has been freshly washed and is put into the cool mixture before it is allowed to become

If you use French dressing, an easy way to serve it is in a bottle with a close glass stopper, in which it can be shaken well. This shaking emulsifies the dressing and makes it thick and delicious with little trouble. Any glass bottle of the right size will do.

RECIPES WITH COFFEE.

Coffee Frappe.

Three cups strong coffee, one cup of sugar, one cup thick cream. Dissolve the sugar in the coffee. Chill; add the cream and freeze to a mush. Use an equal quantity of ice and salt

Coffee Sauce.

One and one-half cups milk, onecup sugar, three-quarters teaspoon of arrowroot, a few grains of salt. Scald milk with coffee and let stand for twenty minutes. Mix remaining ingredients and pour on gradually the not infusion which has been strained. Cook five minutes and serve hot. Good to serve with vanilla ice cream.

Coffee Custard.

Four tablespoons ground coffee, one quart milk, two-thirds cup sugar, onehalf tablespoon cornstarch, one-eighth teaspoon salt, four eggs.

Add the ground coffee to the milk, put in a double boiler and scald, keep the lid on during the preparation, and strain carefully. Pour the hot liquid cornstarch and salt. Strain and make in a moderate oven. When puffy on top and firm in the centre, the custard s finished.
