ORIGIN OF FAIRY TALES AND STORY TELLING

Primitive Man was Desirous of Imparting Knowledge That Would Amuse — Rousseau's Work Gave an Impetus to Child Study—First Record of "Mother Goose" Dates Back as Far as the Year 1729.

The origin of story telling has been ascribed to different impulses or desires of primitive man. Some authorities say that the story resulted merely from the desire of primitive man to impart knowledge or to amuse. Others ascribe it to the overflow of the imagination. The best authorities seem to agree however that the origin of the story is found in the longing of primitive man to express his desires, hopes and disappointments.

By means of the story he satisfies longings, denied gratification in real life. Giants representing the adverse forces of nature are conquered by the gods representing the beneficent forces. The horse myths are good examples of such material. Fairies grant the wish that Nature denies. By means of the story primitive man tries to convince himself or others as to these things. As the belief of primitive man changed, his stories changed or were outgrown.

Comparatively few books or stories definitely planned for children appeared before Rousseau's work gave the impetus to child study. The few on record in the first period were uninteresting.

In the second period a more child-like literature is found. La Fontaine who lived about 1621-1695 wrote many

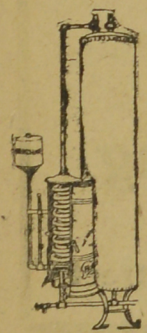
