OIL SHALES OF ALBERT CO.  
WILL SOON BE DEVELOPED

The Anglo-Persian Company Will Take Hold of the Proposi-

tion—The British Government Said to be Interested to the  
Extent of Two Million Pounds—Bill Passed by the HouseYesterday—Another Discussion Over St. John Wharfage  
Rates.

Assembly Chamber April 15, 1919.  
The House met at 4 o'clock.

MR. BURCHILL presented the re-  
port of the committee on Corporations.  
MR. TILLEY introduced a bill to  
incorporate the Rothesay Sewerage  
Company.

HON. MR. MURRAY introduced  
a bill to provide for temporary loans.

HON. MR. VENIOT moved for the  
suspension of Rule 77 to permit of the  
introduction of a bill to amend the  
act relating to the New Brunswick  
Trust Company. Leave having been  
granted he presented the petition of  
Henry R. Ross and others for the pas-  
sage of the bill.

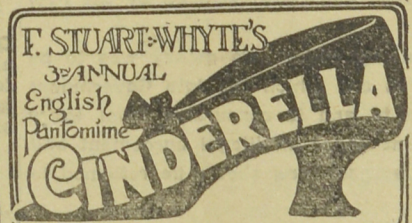

as originally presented to the House.

HON. MR. FOSTER announced  
that his Honor the Lieutenant Govern-  
or would enter the chamber at 5.30  
o'clock to give the Royal assent to a  
number of bills.

MR. BAXTER submitted another  
amendment to the wharfage bill fixing  
the maximum charge on lumber at  
fifteen cents and on general cargo at  
thirty-five cents.

MR. POTTS said that his name had  
been attached as promoter of the bill  
and he wished to say that he had not  
been advised in regard to the amend-  
ments. The Commissioner wanted the  
bill to go through as presented but  
he (Potts) had found himself called  
upon to vote for amendments about  
which he knew nothing. If that was  
the kind of treatment he was to re-  
ceive he would in future let the hon.  
member for the County of St. John  
take charge of St. John Legislation.

The Bill was agreed to as amended.  
The Committee next went into con-  
sideration of a bill to incorporate the  
Albert Mines Holding Company.

MR. PECK explained that the appli-  
cants held some 1400 acres of land in  
Albert County under a mining lease.  
They wanted to transfer the property  
to the Anglo-Persian company compos-  
ed of British capitalists who were  
planning to develop the Oil Shales.  
They had oil shales in Scotland but  
he had been informed by reliable au-  
thority that they were not to be com-  
pared to those in the County of Al-  
bert, and would not produce as high  
rate of oil per ton. He was anxious  
to see capital interested in the shale  
deposits of his County. This was an  
age of development and now that the  
war had ended he was hopeful that  
outside capital would be attracted by  
the great resources of New Brunswick.

MR. BAXTER moved an amendment  
to the effect that the Company be placed  
under the Public Utilities Commis-  
sion. He said this was a question of  
principle. Here was a company which  
he considered, although the statement  
was challenged, in the nature of a  
public utility and should be in the in-  
terest of the province as its activities  
would be based on one of the natural  
resources. If this was to be loaded with  
fictitious stock it would not be in the  
best interests of the public. Everyone  
wanted to see the shales of Albert  
County developed and everyone wanted  
to see the money put in this enter-  
prise used for development and not  
for speculation. He would refer to a  
certain matter although it might oc-  
casion soreness in some quarters. Had  
this principle been applied to the tim-  
ber areas of the province held on lease  
issued by the government would the  
province have found itself in the po-  
sition which it recently had, of stand-  
ing by and seeing these timber limits  
passed from hand to hand at remark-  
ably enhanced prices, and yet reaping  
no benefit.

MR. PECK said he was decidedly  
against this amendment which would  
virtually kill the bill. The bill was one  
of utmost importance to Albert Coun-  
ty and indeed the province. It was for  
the development of a great national  
resource. The Holding Company was  
to be capitalized only at \$5,000 and
