OF INTEREST TO WOMEN

FLY BATTING SEASON.

The Warm Weather Brings With It
the Discomfort of Fly Time.

The housewife must wage a definite
war against the fly if she wishes to
banish this death-dealing, disease-
breeding menace from the premises.

The fly not only carries poison, but
also typhoid, infantile paralysis and
many kindred germs. Food exposed in
warm weather offers a very desirable
breeding place for this dangerous pest.

Clean up the premises and yards and
see that all garbage cans are disinfected
and kept covered. Do not allow
any piles of rubbish or waste to accumu-
late. Do not take a chance on leav-
ing the windows and doors open in
warm sunny weather without placing
screens. See that all windows and
doors are securely screened.

Keep Food Covered.

Cover all foods that are exposed
with wire or mosquito netting. These
screens can be made by removing the
ends of a box and then proceeding to
cover it with wire or netting.

Do not permit milk vessels or cook-
ing utensils to stand around. Rinse
them with cold water and then cleanse
them with hot water very thoroughly.
If there are small children, watch that
no scraps of food are left by them to
attract flies.

First and last of all, swat the fly.
Swat him early and late. It is possible
with very little trouble to keep the
house absolutely free from this men-
acing pest.

Anti-Fly Rules.

Keep the house screened.
Kill each and every fly in the house.
Do not allow food to stand in the ex-
posed condition.

Keep the garbage pail well covered.
Disinfect the garbage can twice a
week.

Do not allow rubbish to accumulate.
Repair all breaks in screens and
doors as soon as they appear.

See that the screen door has a good
catch for a quick closing.

Fresh air, sunlight and clean pre-
mises prevent disease.

STRAWBERRY SHORTCAKE.

Three eggs, one cupful sugar, two of
flour, one tablespoonful of butter, a
teaspoonful (heaped) of baking pow-
der. Beat the butter and sugar to-
gether, and add the eggs well beaten.
Stir in the flour and baking powder,
well sifted together. Bake in deep tin
plates. With three pints of strawber-
ries mix a cupful of sugar. Spread the
fruit between the layers of cake. The
top layer of strawberries may be cov-
ered with a meringue made with the
white of an egg and a tablespoonful of
powdered sugar.

GETTING ALL THE LEMON.

The scent and flavor of lemon peel
is in minute cells close to the surface
of the fruit. By slicing a lemon very
thin you cut through these cells and
so obtain twice the quantity or benefit
from a lemon. Much of the oil is in
the white peel, which you may discov-
er by rubbing a lump of sugar over it.

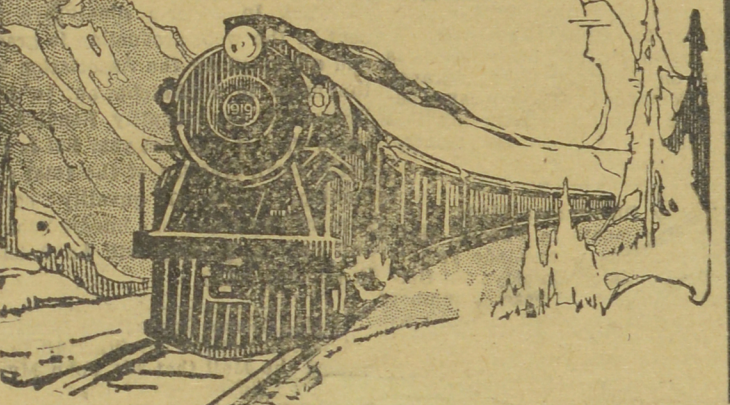
