

## MARYSVILLE QUIT AND GAME AWARDED TO Y.

No Official Umpire at Monday Evening's Game—Dispute of Decision Ended Play.

The Marysville-Y. M. C. A. game in the York County Baseball League series at the Trotting Park Monday evening ended in a fiasco, Marysville quitting in the fourth inning and refusing to continue. The umpire declared the game forfeited to Y. M. C. A. and won by that team 5 to 0. The absence of an official umpire or even one outside the league who would have been satisfactory to the teams was the cause of the trouble. The public will not support baseball in this section even with admission on gate not charged and voluntary contributions resorted to, unless the umpire matter is settled and the crabbing and scrapping which has marred league games so far this season, cut out.

Vincent Boyne catcher for the Imperials went in as volunteer umpire. His task was a disagreeable one and the players did not do much in the way of showing consideration. This was particularly true of Marysville. In the fourth inning Anderson the Marysville pitcher filled the bases by two bases on balls and a hit and then forced a run by hitting Jarvis with the ball. Marysville disputed the decision claiming that Jarvis had been hit after the delivered ball was a strike. This ended the game. The run forced in was the only run of the game

and play had been even up to that time.

### Good Pitching.

Jack Bolster was used in the box by the Y. team. He pitched well. In four innings but three hits were made off him and one of them was not deserved. Williams came over and took Boyce's drive in the third but when he went to field Collett out at second there was no person covering the bag. Bolster pulled out of several bad holes by the strike-out route ranning six Marysville batters. Anderson also was in good form. Until fourth there had been no hit off him. Everything pointed to an intesting game when the dispute of the umpire's decision ended play.

If Maryville had won Y. M. C. A. still would have been leaders of the league by a narrow margin. As it is the position of the Y. team is improved at the top of the standing.

Marysville is slated to play at Woodstock today in connection with the horse-races there. Jack Bolster and Fraser of the Y. M. C. A. team are to play with Marysville team, Bolster pitching.

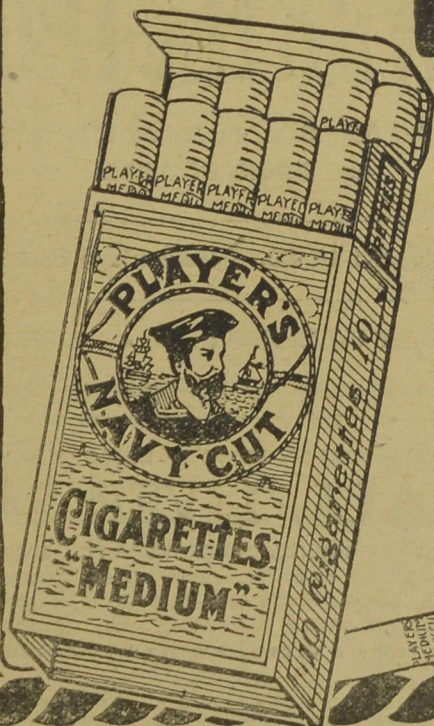
