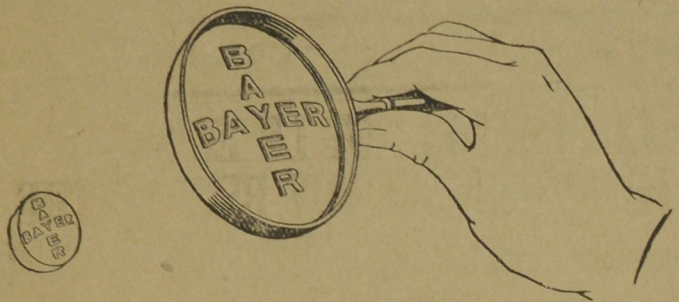

THE EX-KAISER REFUSES TO DISCUSS HIS PLANS

Berlin, Dec. 27.—Although the ex-Kaiser is spending a considerable part of the millions he has succeeded in wresting from the German people on a propaganda whose purpose is the restoration of the Hohenzollern dynasty it is hardly surprising that he should be highly indignant at the monarchist party in Austria which is working for the return of the Ex-Emperor Charles.

Dutch journalist for the purpose of the royal exile that he has even allowed himself to be interviewed by a Dutch journalist for the purpose of giving vent to his anger. The Hague reporter thus honored found "His Imperial Majesty" at his favorite pastime of felling trees. William declared that as the splinters of wood were flying from under his axe so would the official heads of the worthless officials put into office by the republican government fly off when he returned to power in Germany.

Then switching off to the subject of the Austrian monarchistic efforts the Ex-Kaiser said: "For Austrians to be working for the return of the Hapsburgs is nothing less than suicidal. The Hapsburgs have always been the curse of Austria because of their utter selfishness and total lack of initiative and energy. For Austria—I mean the German speaking part of the Austrian nation—there is only one way to salvation and that is a close union with Germany, and only if German Austria is linked up with her may Germany once more hope to become a world power and fulfil her destiny, mutilated as she is after the disastrous peace of Versailles."

"The demand for the return of the weak-minded Emperor Charles does not really come from the heart of the German Austrian people, but is simply a result of the intrigues of France which leaves no means untried to prevent the resurrection of Germany. It is France and France alone, that wishes to see established a weak Austrian monarchy, which would in reality be a mere vassal state, economically and politically dependent on Paris and at the same time a bulwark against Soviet Russia, on one side and Germany on the other. If my poor country had a real government at the present moment, there would be no danger of France succeeding, but unfortunately the present German government see most to have no other aim than to give in to the entente on every point as soon as a demand is made."
