SEASONABLE DESSERTS

Italian Custard Allow one egg to each person. the yolks to a cream; add sugar and lemon juice to taste, beating all the while. The eggs should thicken like cream. Put this into custard gasses Beat the whites to a stiff froth. When perfectly stiff, whip in a little cur rant jelly, and beat until evenly colored. Heap this upon the custard in the glasses. Set in refrigerator to get very cod.

Orange Jelly

One box gelatin, one-half sup cold water, one cup boiling water, juice of one lemon, one cup sugar, one pint orange juice. Soak the gelatin in cold water uneil soft. Add the boiling water, the lemon juice, sugar, and orange juice. Stir till the sugar is dissolved and strain.

Cornstarch Blanc Mange

Stir together two tablespoonsful of cornstarch, half a cup of sugar, the juice and a little of the grated rind of one lemon; mix the whole with cold water enough to dissolve well. Then pour boiling water over the mixture, stirring meanwhile, until it becomes transparent. Allow it to bubble a few minutes longer, pour into moulds, and serve cold with cream and sugar.

Rice and Cream Pudding

Boil one and a half teacups of rice boiling until the rice is of a creamy consistency. Remove from the fire add a third of a teaspoon of salt, a ourth of a nutmeg grated, a teacup of hite sugar, butter the size of a wal it, and two teacups of stewed prunes oned and sweetened while stewing Bake for an hour slowly, stirring of casionally, and finally browning the top. Should be of the consistency o thick cream when done. Eat very cold. without sauce.

Potato and Cheese Casserole

Five cupfuls well seasoned mashe tato. Mix together the cheese and egg, fill in the hollow with it and hear the remaining potato over it. Brus' lightly with milk and bake uncovered n a hot oven for thirty minutes. mixture should be heaped up in th
