### SEASONABLE DESSERTS

#### Italian Custard

Allow one egg to each person. Beat the yolks to a cream; add sugar and lemon juice to taste, beating all the while. The eggs should thicken like cream. Put this into custard gasses. Beat the whites to a stiff froth. When perfectly stiff, whip in a little currant jelly, and beat until evenly colored. Heap this upon the custard in the glasses. Set in refrigerator to get very cold.

#### Orange Jelly

One box gelatin, one-half sup cold water, one cup boiling water, juice of one lemon, one cup sugar, one pint orange juice. Soak the gelatin in cold water until soft. Add the boiling water, the lemon juice, sugar, and orange juice. Stir till the sugar is dissolved and strain.

#### Cornstarch Blanc Mange

Stir together two tablespoonsful of cornstarch, half a cup of sugar, the juice and a little of the grated rind of one lemon; mix the whole with cold water enough to dissolve well. Then pour boiling water over the mixture, stirring meanwhile, until it becomes transparent. Allow it to bubble a few minutes longer, pour into moulds, and serve cold with cream and sugar.

#### Rice and Cream Pudding

Boil one and a half teacups of rice in a double boiler with a quart of milk or water until the liquid is all absorbed. Add a quart of milk and continue the boiling until the rice is of a creamy consistency. Remove from the fire; add a third of a teaspoon of salt, a fourth of a nutmeg grated, a teacup of white sugar, butter the size of a walnut, and two teacups of stewed prunes, stoned and sweetened while stewing. Bake for an hour slowly, stirring occasionally, and finally browning the top. Should be of the consistency of thick cream when done. Eat very cold, without sauce.

#### Potato and Cheese Casserole

Five cupfuls well seasoned mashed potatoes, one and a half cupfuls diced dairy cheese, one egg. Thoroughly oil a two-quart casserole and line it with three cupfuls of the mashed potato. Mix together the cheese and egg, fill in the hollow with it and heap the remaining potato over it. Brush lightly with milk and bake uncovered in a hot oven for thirty minutes. The mixture should be heaped up in the centre.

### SUGGESTIONS

Old felt hats make excellent soles for bedroom slippers or for inner soles to slip in rubbers to keep the feet warm.

When fasteners of a glove pull out darn the hole and sew an ordinary dress snap near the old fastening and the glove is useful again.

The quickest way to stone raisins is to place them on a tin plate and heat them thoroughly in a hot oven. The heat causes the raisins to split easily and it is no trouble to remove the stones.

A pinch of baking soda will make lima or butter beans more tender and digestible if added when they are boiling. It also hastens the cooking by one-half the time required.

## THE WONDERS OF WIRELESS TELEGRAPHY

These strange signals which are being caught at wireless stations on different parts of our planet are a prob to the big scientists themselves. How much more, then must they puzzle the brains of the ordinary people? asks Pearson's Weekly.

There are hundreds of different wireless stations. Why then, asks the man in the street, is it that only one station here and there picks up these incomprehensible sounds from the void?

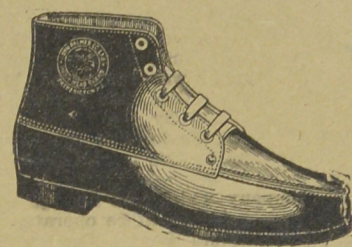
The answer is this—that each sending instrument can be tuned, like a fiddle or banjo string, to send or receive signals of a certain wave length. A receiver tuned to catch a short wave cannot take a long one, and vice versa.

Now the waves which bring these signals from the unknown are of great length. Consequently the ordinary receiver tuned for taking ordinary messages does not recognize them.

The bigger the station, and the greater the sending distance, the longer, as a rule, is the wave used. Take Clifden in Ireland and Glace Bay in Nova Scotia as an example. It is between these two—a distance of

2300 miles—that the transatlantic wireless service is carried on

The wires used for sending or receiving are about 1000 feet long, and are stretched at a height of about 200 feet. The wave length employed is 20,000 feet—that is each wave or ripple is nearly four miles long from crest to crest. Fifty thousand of these waves are emitted each second, and the waves rush through the ether across the Atlantic at a speed of 186,300 miles per second, and so take one seventy-fifth part of a second to fly from one side of the Atlantic to the other.

The signals that have been coming in from space—perhaps from Mars—are produced by ether waves even longer than those used by the giant stations which span the Atlantic.

## DIVORCES WILL SOON EQUAL WEDDINGS

Chicago, Aug. 11.—If the present rate of increase of divorces over marriages continues, Chicago by 1950 will be a city of wrecked homes according to W. F. McDermott of Chicago.

"Last year" said Mr. McDermott, "there were 37,583 marriages and between 5,000 and 6,000 divorces. This shows an increase of 20 per cent. since 1911. Three decades more will see the number of divorces equaling the

number of marriages.

"A study of the fundamental trouble shows that of 3,577 suits filed in 1914 only seventy owned their homes. In 2,171 cases there were no children.

"Increasing childless couples, the growth of the apartment habit and the tendency toward ease, indulgence and fast living only presage more broken homes and greater menace to the future of America"
