HINTS TO HOUSEWIVES.

Add a pinch of salt to eggs when whipping. It will hasten the process.

Do not salt meats until nearly done. To do so draws out the juices and toughens the fiber.

In cleaning your hairbrush dip the bristles downward into the water and out again, keeping the back from the water as much as possible.

When doing kitchen work keep the hands smooth by rubbing with salt and rinsing with tepid water.

Kid gloves should not be pulled off by the finger tips but carefully drawn from the hands.

Spirits of camphor is a very good lotion to keep on your dressing table in case of any emergency connected with burns or cuts.

If embroidery is basted carefully on white wrapping paper (not stiff, but the soft kind) one can easily dispense with hoops and it does not mar the embroidery as the hoops do.

MACARONI WITH POACHED EGG.

One-quarter cup macaroni, three cups boiling water, one egg, two teaspoons grated cheese, salt. Cook the macaroni and mold in squares. Poach egg and place on top of square. Salt, Sprinkle with grated cheese, and serve with garnish of parsley.

MAPLE SYRUP CAKE.

One-half cup shortening, one-half cup sugar, four egg yolks, one cup maple syrup, one-half cup hot water, two and one-half cups flour, two teaspoons baking-powder, one-half teaspoon soda, one-half teaspoon maple-syrup, one quarter teaspoon salt. Cream shortening, add sugar, beat well, add well-beaten yolks (two eggs may be used in place of the four yolks if desired), syrup and hot water. Sift together flour, salt, and baking powder, and add to first mixture. Add flavoring, beat well, and pour into oiled pans to depths of one inch. Bake in moderate oven, and cover with maple frosting, or with maple fudge frosting.

To Mend Kid Gloves.

Kid gloves can be mended at home so that they look very well and will last a long time. First remove all of the ragged edges with a small pair of sharp scissors. Now buttonhole both edges to be mended with cotton thread. Never make the mistake of using silk, as it cuts; then bring both edges together and buttonhole. A glove mended in this way can not pull out or rip and will stand the hardest kind of wear.

BOY SCOUTS TO GO ABROAD

Boy Scouts of America who are going overseas to have a powwow with their British chums and Boy Scouts from thirty other nations will sail July 5 aboard an army transport from Hoboken. During the passage the Scouts will be formed into temporary troops for orderly conduct. The big gathering will be held in Olympia, near London, July 30 to August 7, and will be preceded by a tour of the Belgian and French battlefields. So far 220 Scouts have been selected for the trip, it was announced yesterday by the national headquarters 200 Fifth avenue.

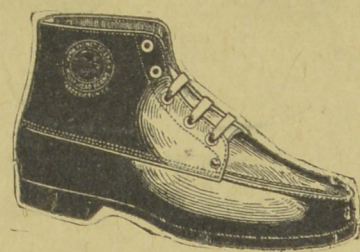

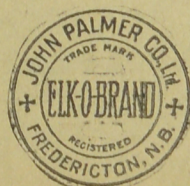
