

FORMER DEVON PASTOR DIES IN ST. JOHN

REV. W. R. ROBINSON
CALLED SUDDENLY

Acute Indigestion and Heart
Trouble Cause of His De-
mise—Was Widely
Known.

Friends in this city and Devon were greatly shocked this morning to learn of the sudden death of Rev. W. R. Robinson, pastor of the Ludlow Street Baptist Church, who passed away at his home in St. John West. He had been confined to his home for a short time from an attack of acute indigestion, and was thought to be out of danger, but last night had a turn for the worse. Heart failure was the immediate cause of his demise.

The deceased gentleman was a native of Newcastle and was one of the best known Baptist clergymen in the province. He was a very active temperance worker and the cause has lost a stalwart champion by his death. For some years Mr. Robinson was pastor of the Baptist church at Gibson, but removed to St. John about fifteen years ago and took up his duties as pastor of the Ludlow Street Baptist Church. An earnest preacher and energetic worker, his pastoral labors were attended with great success.

The deceased is survived by a widow, a daughter of the late Mr. T. E. Hoben of South Devon, and one son Thomas, now a student at Acadia College.

The funeral service will be conducted at Ludlow Street Baptist Church by Rev. Dr. Hutchinson, and the body will be brought to this city for burial on Friday morning. Rev. Dr. Kierstead will officiate and interment will be made at the Rural Cemetery.

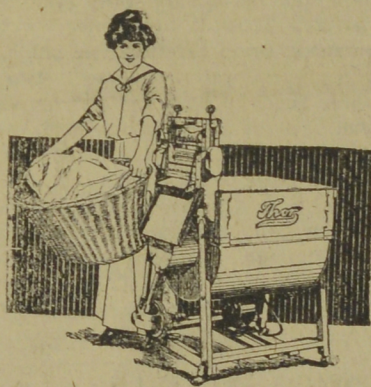
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
