MOVEMENTS OF THE STARS IN FILMLAND

One of the greatest calamities that could come to the American theatre-going public would be to remove the kiss from the sage and screen, according to Constance Talmage, moving picture actress star of "Two Weeks," her latest First National attraction. Japan has done it and Miss Talmage fears that certain reformers may attempt the same thing in this country. "We can get along without whiskey and beer drinking scenes, but when they attempt to cut out the kiss, to spoil romance, those reformers will find that it won't work in America as it does in the Orient," she said.

Earl Williams, who made such a success of his role as the young Lord Bannister in "When a Man Loves," is soon to have another typically English role. He will appear as "Captain Swift" in the famous play of that name by C. Hadden Chambers. He will have the role created in London by the late Sir Herbert Tree and in this country by the late Maurice Barrymore.

Shirley Mason, the William Fox star who is now working on "Her Elephant Man," a story by Pearl Doles BBell, will demonstrate her ability as a circus bareback rider in this picture.

George Walsh's latest starring vehicle for Fox, "The Shark," is nearing completion under the direction of Dell Henderson.

In her sixth Selznick picture, which has been announced under the working title of "Glorious Youth," Olive Thomas will have as a leading man Crawford Kent, one of the best known and most popular actors in motion pictures. Mr. Kent was the leading man for Alice Brady in two pictures and has appeared opposite Clara Kimball Young and Marguerite Clark.

Owen Moore is spending most of his time in the country nowadays, accompanied by Director Wesley Ruggles. Seens Owens and members of his supporting cast in the new Selznick comedy, "The Woman Hater."

Rapid progress is being made in the production of Eugene O'Brien's latest picture, "His Wife's Money," at the Fort Lee studios. The final scenes are well under way, under the direction of Ralph Ince.

One of the best O. Henry's short stories, "Double-Dyed Detective," has been purchased by Goldwyn Pictures Corporation for Jack Pickford, and will be placed in production as soon as he has completed "The Little Shepherd of Kingdom Come," by John Fox, Jr., on which he is now working at the Culver City Studios.
