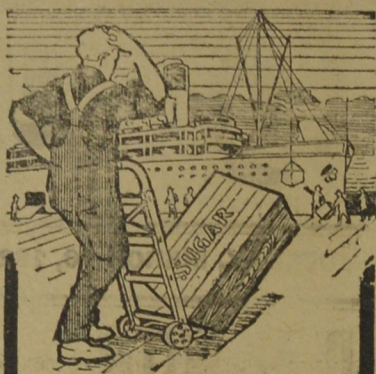

ICELANDIC TEAM AFTER ALLAN CUP

Falcons of Winnipeg Claimed by West to Have the Goods—They are Systematic Players.

Winnipeg, March 15.—When the Falcons, pride of Winnipeg hockey fandom, and champions of the West, step on the ice at Toronto in the tussle for the Allan Cup, Eastern fans will see one of the greatest combinations of hockey talent that has come out of the West in recent years. Being composed entirely of Icelandic boys, and coming up together, every boy being a local product, the local aggregation has provided surprise after surprise in a wonderful season of hockey in Winnipeg. They had to fight their way into senior ranks in the committee room and nearly lost, but have since showed their mettle by ousting the star Selkirk Man. team, and coming through to the final of the Canadian Amateur hockey championship by playing sound and brilliant hockey.

Steady—Not Brilliant.

The Icelanders are not a spectacular team by any means, and possess but one or two stars, but they have evolved a system that is hard to beat. The defence hasn't allowed more than five goals in any one game, and have scored several shut-outs, while the forwards seem to have the ability of scoring goals. In beating the Selkirk team for the Manitoba championship the team showed that it is much stronger than the aggregation that represented the West at Toronto last spring, and nearly gave the Hamiltonians heart failure by their strong comeback in the second game, as this year's Selkirk brigade was strengthened by several stars returning from overseas. The Falcons have a much better forward line than that which represented Selkirk at Toronto, and in Frank Frederickson have a centre player who compares with the best in the game. Frederickson is a big fellow, very fast and a corking shot.

LALONDE HOGS PUCK TOO MUCH

Montreal, March 15.—E. W. Ferguson in the Montreal Herald says that George Kennedy of the Canadiens is going to make a motion the next time the National Hockey League meets to the effect that the publication of the official scoring lists be prohibited. He continues: "The newspapers of course cannot be prevented from compiling lists, showing who's on top, but Mr. Kennedy wishes to put an end to this. Ambition to lead the scorers badly influences a player's usefulness to his club, for he won't pass the puck when he thinks he has any chance to score, even if one of his own team mates is in a better position."

Lalonde was a flagrant offender in this connection in the game with Ottawa, and Manager Kennedy reprimanded him afterwards.

FRED McLEAN HOME AFTER N. H. L. SEASON

Not in the Best of Health While With Quebec—Saw Some of the Fast Amateur Players.

Fred McLean who this season played with Quebec in the National Hockey League arrived here Saturday and intends to remain at his home here for some time. He states that he does not intend to return to Cape Breton where he was living before he was given a chance with Quebec in the N. H. L. Mr. McLean is being warmly greeted by many old friends. While with Quebec he had an attack of influenza and was not in the best of physical condition but nevertheless made good and expects to be back with the "big ring" next winter. He had the distinction of being the only player from the Maritime Provinces with the big professional hockey league. Press reports of his playing were very flattering.

Saw Fast Amateurs

While with the N. H. L. McLean saw the fast Sons of Ireland team. This team although with an Irish name is largely composed of French Canadians. It won the Quebec City league and now is making a strong bid for the Allan Cup. It has won its matches in the Province of Quebec and goes up against the University of Toronto, Intercollegiate title-holders tonight, at Toronto. ARMENIANS CALL FOR ASSISTANCE

Constantinople, March 13.—The Armenian leader Hadjin, northwest of Marash, has sent the following despatches to the Armenian committee at Constantinople:

"March date missing)—Take immediate steps for relief. We shall be annihilated."

"March 6—We beg you for the last time, as danger is imminent, do all you can. We shall be massacred. Come to our relief."

There are approximately 7,000 Armenian refugees in Hajin. Three members of the Armenian committee for relief in the near east are also there.
