DIRT ON THE CARPETS STARTS THE WHITE PLAGUE

Illuminating Address on Tuberculosis by Dr. Elliott of Toronto—Dread Disease was Recognized Hundreds of Years Before the Birth of Christ—Adults Rarely Catch It From Contact With Others, it is Claimed.

A crowded meeting at "Holwood," Queen's Park, the home of Lady Flavelle, yesterday afternoon, testified to the public interest in work for the tuberculosis, in general, and the work of the Samaritan Club in particular. The President, Mrs. Harold Tovell, was in the chair, and after some very interesting moving pictures relating to the work of the organization Dr. J. H. Elliott gave an illuminating address

on the subject of tuberculosis. The early knowledge of the disease was very slight, he said, although it was recognized hundreds of years before the time of Christ. Hippocrates, in 400 B. C., wrote that the malady was curable if treated from the beginning and the leading Greek physicians from the year 200 taught that patients should go to the country and drink plenty of milk fresh from the cow. With regard to the necessity of the milk being "fresh from the cow" Pliny commented that there was no particular virtue in this save that, if it had not passed through the hands of the dealer it would not have been watered.

Disease of Congested Cities

It was recognized even in those days, that it was a disease of congested cities and places where hygiene was poor.

Scrofula in which the suffering was from tubercular glands in the neck was known as "the King's Evil", and supposed to be curable by the King's touch. In this belief the Kings of France and England touched thousands upon thousands of children.

The progress and prevention of any disease is based on the knowledge of its cause and the method by which it is spread. In illustration Dr. Elliott spoke of the way malaria had been cleared up in the tropics through the discovery that the germ was carried by mosquitoes, and of the disappearance of the yellow fever from Havana and other places in the same way. Leprosy was a terrible scourge in England two or three centuries ago, until its transmission was discovered and also smallpox, before vaccination was discovered. The latter was a dreaded disease among the American Indians and they were probably the only people who officially voiced their appreciation of Jenner's work. They sent him two strings of wampum and an address of thanks for having saved their race from decimation.

It was not until 1882 that the tubercle bacillus was discovered by Professor Robert Koch in Germany, and the campaign against it started.

If we could segregate the tuberculous and segregate or kill all the tuberculous animals we would do away with the disease in a short time, Dr. Elliott said. But so many families have some slight taint of the disease that such a program could not be carried out and the work of the world carried on.

England was the first country to open hospitals for the tubercular. These were called hospitals for chest diseases, and the first was established in City Road in London in 1793. They were factors in keeping tuberculosis from other people and in lessening the death rate in England.

Many people have tuberculosis without recognizing it.

Dirt is brought in on one's boots from the street; children play on the carpet, and there's the point of attack. Adults rarely catch it from contact.

Practically all those who suffer from tuberculosis in later life received the primary infection in childhood, Dr. Elliott said. In many cases it never develops, but certain exciting causes make it active, such as unhealthful occupations or living conditions. He spoke of the value of open air schools and said that prevention must go hand in hand with treatment. The efforts so far he said had been directed too much toward the individual and not enough toward the larger issues involving social conditions. And he emphasized very strongly the necessity of all organizations working together to combat the disease.

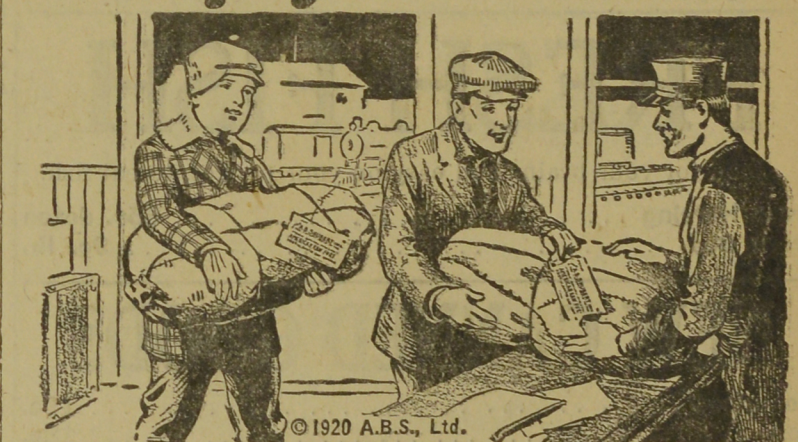
