Good swift game is promised

MARYSVILLE BEATEN BY FREDERICTON; SCORE 5 TO 3

Local Team Still Heads N. B. H. L. Standing — Marysville Roughened Things and Suffered in Penalties — Winners Outstayed Marysville — Anybody's Game Until Final Period — Big Crowd Poorly Handled.

Fredrickton maintained its record of victories in the New Brunswick Hockey League by defeating Marysville for the second time this season at the Arctic Rink last night. The score was five to three with the game decided in the last period of play. Up to that time it was nip and tuck, Fredrickton seemed to have the staying qualities, however, and the margin of superiority is shown by the score.

Crowd Poorly Handled

The biggest crowd of the season, well upwards of fifteen hundred, saw last night's match. It was very poorly handled and some hundreds did not see the first of play at all, so slow were tickets sold. The rush last night caught the rink management unprepared but it is not likely that there will be a repetition of that next week when Chatham will play here. Hockey enthusiasm is at a high pitch this season. Marysville people turned out en masse last night. In fact about every inhabitant of the cotton town who was not sick in bed or crippled, was there. For a time it looked as if they would see their team win.

Losers Penalized Heavily

Referee Staples penalized the losing team heavily, and when penalties counted. Marysville did not have to play the get-the-man game they did and lost by it. Bert Burgess the fast little Fredrickton wing was singled out for especial attention and finally was injured so that he had to retire permanently from the game. In every game he has played this winter Burgess has been a target for attack, such is his reputation as a dangerous player. The only "scrap" of the match was about two minutes from the end of play when Jarvis and Brewer clouted at one another with their sticks and finally clinched. Both were banished for the balance of time.

Hard and Fast Game

It was a fast and hard game with little let-up. Fredrickton took a lead of two goals early and never was headed although Marysville tied the score up in the second period. Fredrickton uncovered a new player in Archie Williams of the U. N. B. squad. Intercollegiate rules have shut him out of college hockey as a special student. His showing last night was a revelation. His position is point and he was used in that at first but after Burgess retired he was put on the wing and was in the game at all stages scoring one of the goals for the winners. Jack Arnold staged a comeback with Marysville and played well. The other players all had played before this season. The losing team did not show up as well as it did against Bathurst but that may be accounted for by the fact that it was up against what so far has been the strongest team of the league. Clarence Wade and Edgar Wade were in extra good form but had the tendency of all their team to mix things when it would be better to adhere to the rules.

College Players Strong

The U. N. B. players Lounsbury, Burgess, Jewett and Williams, as all through the season were the mainstay of Fredrickton. All but one goal were scored by them. The fifth was played

by Colwell who played a brilliant game at centre. Hall who was one of Fredrickton's subs was not used very long but while on held C. Wade down pretty well. Jewett played one of the best coverpoint games seen here in many seasons.

Star Play in the Nets

The playing of both goal-keepers is worthy of particular mention. Tart Titus the veteran Fredrickton captain never played a better game in his life. He was most reckless in going out of his net but got away with every attempt. Bidlake played a more conservative game. Without Titus' long ex-


