AFFAIRS IN RUSSIA.

Russian volunteer forces have achieved a "great victory" over the Bolsheviki in the region of the Don, the remnants of Denekine's army thereby saving themselves from extinction at the hands of the Reds. The news comes from Odessa by way of Archangel, which is a long way round. It may be true, however, since recent cabled advices have had Denekine's badly shattered army in the territory of the Kuban Cossacks undergoing re organization under the supervision of officers of the British army. General Denekine, however, cannot have share of the credit for this great vic tory, if there has been one, since he is reported to have just arrived at the Bulgarian port of Varna, his reputed destination being Bucharest.

Apparently as an offset to this news of a Red repulse in the region of the Don, the Soviet government at Mos cow announces that Bolshevik troops have followed up the taking of Niko laiev and Kherson with the "capture" of a number of villages in the Odessa region. If the repulse of the Red forces in the Don country is real the capture of a few undefended villages is not much of an offset.

Siberia adds its full quota to the Russian ministry. Only a few days ago we were told that the Czech forces had arrived at Vladivostok to return to Europe by sea. Now comes the report that the Czechs have taken Irkutsk, more than 2,000 miles west of Vladivostok and are "returning westward through Europe to relieve the Roumanians, Serbs and Poles."
