Some one else replied that it was very simple, with only two steps necessary. One was to increase the range of the instrument and that comparatively easy, the other was to proceed to New York and leave a "live" receiver lying about somewhere suitably hidden, and of course attached to a mine of explosives. 

As a consequence food and clething manufactured articles and raw material have had to be imported into Europe.

U. S. Reaped a Harvest

The United States of America has reaped a harvest in selling supplies to the stricken countries. According to the official reports of that country the rest of the world owed her almost \$4,000,000,000 in 1919. Practically the bulk of this was owed by Europe. She simply had to buy no matter what the price. Canada in minor fashion also benefitted by the flew of exports to Europe. But with us latterly that has been almost balanced by the exchange against us across the border.

But even the wor mwill turn and Europe with the recent tremendous drop in exchange has had to refrain from purchasing goods on this side of the Atlantic, as with the odds so much against her it seemed impossible that she could ever pay the staggering sums that the export prices plus the premiums amount to.
