

FINNAN HADDIE A LA NEWBURG.

Pour boiling water over the finnan haddie and cook for 5 minutes. Drain and then break into flakes. Now place in a chafin dish one and a half cups of milk, six level tablespoons of flour. Stir to dissolve and then bring to a boil and add one small onion grated, four tablespoons of finely minced parsley, two pimientos minced fine, one cup of celery cut in dice and parboiled one teaspoon of salt, one and one half teaspoons of paprika, one half teaspoon of white pepper, juice of one lemon, one-half teaspoon of grated rind of lemon. Heat until scalding hot, add finnan haddie and cook until well heated. Serve on toast.

You simply say to the drug store man, "Give me a quarter of an ounce of freezone." This will cost very little but is sufficient to remove every hard or soft corn from one's feet.

A few drops applied directly upon a tender, aching corn should relieve the soreness instantly and soon the entire corn, root and all, can be lifted out with the fingers without pain.

This new drug called freezone is an ether compound discovered by a Cincinnati man, who says that while freezone is sticky, it dries in a moment, and simply shrivels up the corn without inflaming or even irritating the surrounding tissue or skin.

Don't let father die of infection or lockjaw from whittling at his corns, but cut this out and make him try it.

CARE OF A PIANO.

Dampness is very injurious to a piano. Therefore do not place the piano against an outside wall. Keep your piano free from dust. Keep it closed when not in use. Do not place heavy ornaments on top of a piano, as it deadens the quantity of tone. Have your piano tuned every three months whether used much or little. An upright sounds better if placed two inches from the wall. To maintain the luster of the case wash it over quickly with mild, white soap, dry immediately and polish with a silk duster absolutely clean.

If any of the keys stick or remain down it is a sure sign of dampness.

Get a pair of bicycle clips and attach them to the rolled up sleeves. The sleeves will not fall down and even a dainty shirt waist may be kept clean.

A convenient string holder may be made of a small funnel hung in a corner of the kitchen. A ball of string should be put in the funnel, the loose cord extending down through the stem.

PRECAUTIONS AGAINST FLU

Dr. Copeland, Commissioner of Public Health for New York City, has issued the following appeal in connection with the outbreak of influenza:

To Nurses—The city is suffering from lack of nurses. Please volunteer for service at \$6 a day or 75c. a hour. Persons with practical experience in nursing will be paid \$4 a day or 50c. an hour.

SCARCE; SILKS
ADVANCING

Montreal, Feb. 9—Bradstreets Weekly Trade Report says: The outlook in the dry goods trade for the present year indicates that there will not be any improvement as far as supplies are concerned. The world demand for goods has reached untold huge proportions, and the effort to fill orders by manufacturers is partially paralyzed by the short hours, and scarcity of raw material; prices therefore, keep going up all the time. The exchange situation is another big factor for increasing prices. Silks have advanced 12 to 20 per cent.


