Storm Stayed Plane Away The Fairey type plane in which Col. Leckie and Major Hobbs arrived at Kingsclear from Riviere du Loup, which became storm-stayed at that point, was the first to get away. This machine yesterday had engine trouble and later had its floats leaking to such an extent that there was fear of its sinking. The plane was taken under the highway bridge and slung to its superstructure by block and tackle. While it was in that position repairs were made to the floats after they had been pumped out.
