## ALLOWANCE RULE PASSED BY AMERICAN ASS'N

The American Trotting Association at its congress last week adopted the time allowance rule of the National association code, which allows a horse two seconds a year with the added provision that a horse racing under the advantage of a time allowance secures a new winrace for purposes of classification when it wins inside the allowance. That is, one of the old, out-classed, free-for-all pacers racing with an allowance of six seconds starts out as a 2.15 pacer over the half-mile tracks. He wins in 2.11½ and then becomes a 2.12 pacer. In other words, the new clause puts a winning horse at once where he shows he is capable of going

**Cutting Down the Cost**  
The demand for racing at a reduced cost to owners has been liberally met by the Great Western Circuit tracks. Each member of the circuit is pledged to give at least \$7000 in added money and only one member La Harpe, Ill., is giving as little as that. Springfield, Ill. adds \$24,000; Hamline, \$22,000; Milwaukee \$20,000; Des Moines and Omaha \$17,000. At Springfield and Milwaukee there will be no deductions from money winners.

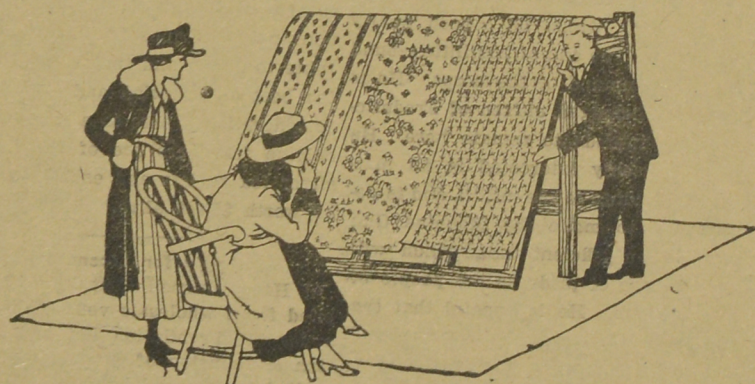
