

## LADY CYNTHIA CURZON WEDDED IN LONDON

London, May 14—In the presence of two Kings and two Queens and in defiance of the ancient superstition that May marriages are unlucky Lady Cynthia Curzon daughter of the British Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs was married to Lieut. Oswald Ernald Mosley youngest member of the House of Commons in the Royal Chapel at St. James's Palace here this afternoon.

In further defiance of superstition green was the motif in the gowns of the bridesmaids and flower girls. These gowns were of Nile colored silk. They carried water lilies. The bride carried a Honiton lace handkerchief and wore the famous pearls which her mother, who was Miss Mary Victoria Leiter of Chicago wore when she was married to Lord Curzon.

### Brilliant Wedding

The wedding was the most brilliant which has been seen here in many years. Besides King George and Queen Mary, King Albert and Queen Eliza-

beth of the Belgians, the most prominent diplomatists and personages of England were present at the ceremony. King Albert and Queen Elizabeth came from Brussels to London by airplane last Saturday to attend the wedding. They are staying with Lord Curzon.

With King George and Queen Mary and King Albert and Queen Elizabeth present, the tact of Lady Curzon step-mother of the bride, also an American was put to a severe test to restrict the invitations to two hundred persons, all that the Royal Chapel will hold. However when Lady Curzon had accomplished this work a great burden fell on the police who were hardly able to hold back the crowd which thronged Carlton House Terrace, the Pall Mall entrance to the Ambassador's courtyard and the Mall, impartially cheering the bride and royalty. Indeed two women were nearly run down by the bride's automobile while they were endeavoring to scream their good wishes to her. Mounted policemen were obliged to charge the crowd when the bride arrived at the palace.

The bride was given away by her father, Lord Curzon and was attended by seven bridesmaids. The elaborateness of her trousseau and her striking

beauty have been the talk of all England for weeks. Pictures of her and long articles describing her trousseau have been printed in the last few days by all the leading English papers. She is the second daughter of the late Lady Curzon who was a daughter of the late L. Z. Leiter of Chicago and herself a most beautiful woman.

King George and Queen Mary laid aside their mourning to attend the wedding, despite the fact that it was the day when Princess Margaret of Denmark was buried in Copenhagen. The Queen wore a beautiful flowered blue brocade gown and jewels. The King wore a gardenia in his buttonhole.

Queen Elizabeth was lovely in a cloak of rose colored Du Barry velvet over a soft gray gown, with a cloth of gold bodice.

The American Ambassador and Mrs. John W. Davis were among the guests. Mr. and Mrs. Davis were among the first to arrive at the Royal Chapel. Soon they were followed by Viscount and Lady Astor.

Lady Curzon gave a reception at Carlton House Terrace after the wedding. About a hundred were invited.
