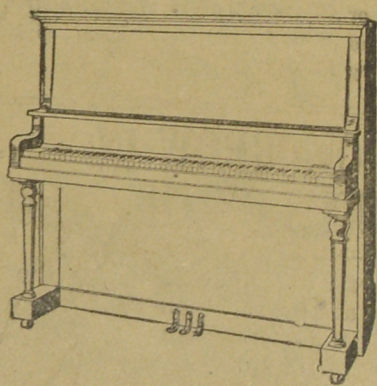

## GIANTS MUST USE DEVELOPED MATERIAL

Deals Proposed by McGraw Have Not Gone Through—Zimmerman and Chase Still Uncertain.

San Antonio, Tex., March 10—Manager John J. McGraw, of the Giants has assumed command of the squad. With him from Havana came Larry Doyle and Mike Gonzales, the melancholy Cuban, follows later.

It begins to look as if the holes in the ranks of the Giants must be filled with new players educated in the McGraw kindergarten which has produced many stars. McGraw has made offers for many fully developed players, but could not make deals.

For Roger Hornsby he offered \$70,000 and several players. He made an offer for Rabbit Maranville. This too was turned down. Despite Cincinnati denials, Roush was offered in a trade for Ross Young, but McGraw would not deal.

Asked about the status of Heinie Zimmerman, McGraw said: "This is something I will not discuss. Nor will I discuss the matter of Chase. Anything that is said about these two players must come from the players themselves."

"It looks as though we will have to work with the material we have on hand for the present. I do not know how good that is yet and I will not know for some weeks. But we have developed great players before and we can do it again. Baseball is due for an infusion of new blood all along the line."

## ALLAN CUP MATCHES DRAW ATTENTION

Toronto Not Thinking of Pro. Hockey—Sons of Ireland and Toronto Varsity to Play.

Toronto, March 10—The statement from Vancouver, that the winners of the Pacific Coast League series will not consent to meet Ottawa in Toronto excites no interest here. There is too much good hockey on the cards. It is more than doubtful if the arena could be secured to stage the Stanley Cup games. On Tuesday, March 16, and Thursday March 18, Sons of Ireland, of Quebec, winners of the Quebec Amateur Hockey Association, meet Toronto Varsity, winners of the Intercollegiate League. The total goals scored in the two games will decide this event. The winners are to play the winners in the O. H. A. on March 22 and March 24 in the semi-finals for the Allan Cup, and the finals for this trophy with the Western champions are set for March 27 and 29. With such a program served up to them for the balance of this month, Toronto hockey fans can hardly spare time to think about the professional end of the game.

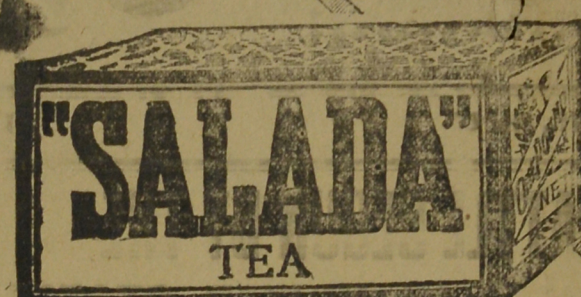

## YOUNG FISHER MAKES VERY LOUD NOISE

Eugene Brosseau of Montreal the French Canadian boxer who some sporting men think has the makings of a world's champion, is to meet Young Fisher of Syracuse, N. Y. on the 15th. The bout was to have taken place last Monday. The postponement appears to have got Fisher's goat for he wrote a very boastful letter to the Montreal press, telling what short work he will make of the Montreal man. Brosseau had little difficulty in putting Roddie McDonald away at Halifax a few days ago.

Young Fisher's record does not make him appear very formidable. It is as follows:

"Young Fisher was knocked out by O'Dowd in three rounds last January. In his bout with Soldier Bartfield at Syracuse last June he was saved by the bell from a knockout in the 10th round. He was also outpointed in 10 rounds with Harry Greb last April at Syracuse, when he substituted for Tommy Robson, who could not appear. Robson was an easy winner over him last March 17 in a 10 round bout. He outpointed Al. McCoy a month previous, Harry Greb gave him a terrible lacing in January, scoring two knock-downs and had him almost out at the final bell. He had been recommended several times as likely to make a good fight with Roddie McDonald."

## PITTSBURG WON OLYMPIC PLACE FROM BOSTON

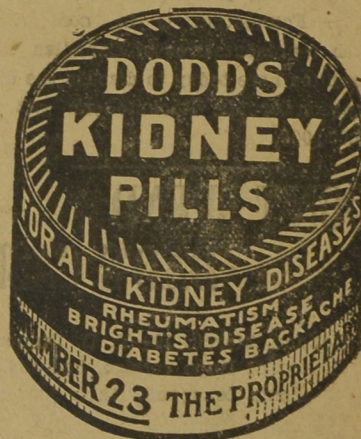
