GOVERNMENT HAS HATCHED A NEW FISCAL POLICY

Important Announcement Made by Hon. Mr. Ballantyne in a Speech at Montreal—Its Preparation Has Been Something of a Rush Job—The Public Will be Interested in Further Announcements.

(Toronto Globe)

Union Government, according to the reported public pronouncement of Hon. C. C. Ballantyne in Montreal, has prepared "a new Canadian fiscal policy." This is "now ready," and will be presented to the House of Commons on the return of Sir Robert Borden about May 1. The Minister describes it in negatives. It is not class legislation, not free trade, not the granting of favors to any one. It is to "cover the diversified interests of Canada, while yielding necessary revenue." It is evidently satisfactory—to Mr. Ballantyne.

The public will await with considerable interest some positive announcement concerning this finished fiscal panacea. Its preparation manifestly has been something of a rush job. It is only a week or so ago that Hon. Arthur Meighen was making speeches advocating a policy of "moderate tariff taxation" while The Montreal Gazette—the journalistic high priest of high protection—approvingly was assuring its clientele that "what Mr. Meighen has advocated involves no departure in either principle or practice from the situation which now exists," an assurance not challenged by the young Minister. It is clear, like wise that the promise of Sir Thomas White a year ago that any revision of the tariff would be preceded by a general investigation by a Tariff Commission with the Minister of Finance at its head, has been abandoned. For once the cotere of nominal and "acting" Ministers which at present composes the Union Government seems to have done something off its own bat and done it in a hurry.

It is unfortunate that the electors of the St. James division of Montreal are not likely to have opportunity to pass upon this "newly-hatched policy" when they go to the polls in the forthcoming by-election. That Mr. Ballantyne deemed it proper—"particularly at this time," as Mr. Meighen is wont to say—to make this most important Government announcement in the city of Montreal may denote an urgent desire on the part of the Administration to detach toward Unionism a section of the French-Canadian electorate who heretofore have steadfastly refused to tie up with any high-tariff Tory party. It is nearly thirty years since political Conservatism was able to secure any substantial support in the Province of Quebec. In 1911, by its alliance with Henry Bourassa and the Nationalists on the anti-navy policy, the Conservative party was enabled to draw sufficient strength from the sister Province to enable its leaders to form the first Borden Government, but the fiscal issue of reciprocity then before the electors in other parts of the Dominion played little or no part in deciding the result in Quebec.

Mr. Ballantyne's Montreal pronouncement will doubtless be interpreted as a deliberate bid to secure some working arrangement with Quebec supporters of Liberal principles in the development of a perpetuated Unionism, freed from the taint of old-time Toryism, decorated by new leadership, and possibly vaulting the "new Canadian fiscal policy" which Mr. Ballantyne says is completed and ready.

WILDE WILL BOX IN CANADA NEXT MONTH

Will Meet Bobby Eber at Windsor, Ont., April 10—Eber the Canadian Title Holder.

Windsor, March 28—Jimmy Wilde, Britain's flyweight champion pugilist, has signed articles to meet "Bobby" Eber of Hamilton at Windsor Monday April 12, in a 10-round bout. Eber must weigh in at 116 pounds at 3 o'clock on the afternoon of the bout. A telegram from Manager Hughes in charge of Wilde brought news of closing of the arrangements.

Wilde will receive \$6,500 for his appearance while his opponent will be paid \$1,000 and training expenses. It was only through effort of the Windsor and district unit of the army and navy veterans Wilde consented to visit Windsor. He was however anxious to display his wares to Canadians as the Prince of Wales before Jimmy left for his tour of the United States requested him not to return home without getting acquainted with the Dominion. Eber was chosen for Wilde's opponent because he is one of few bantams who can make he weight required by the Englishman.

With Eber the recognized champion of his class in Canada, his appearance here is expected to draw hundreds of boxing enthusiasts from Hamilton Toronto and other cities of Western Ontario.

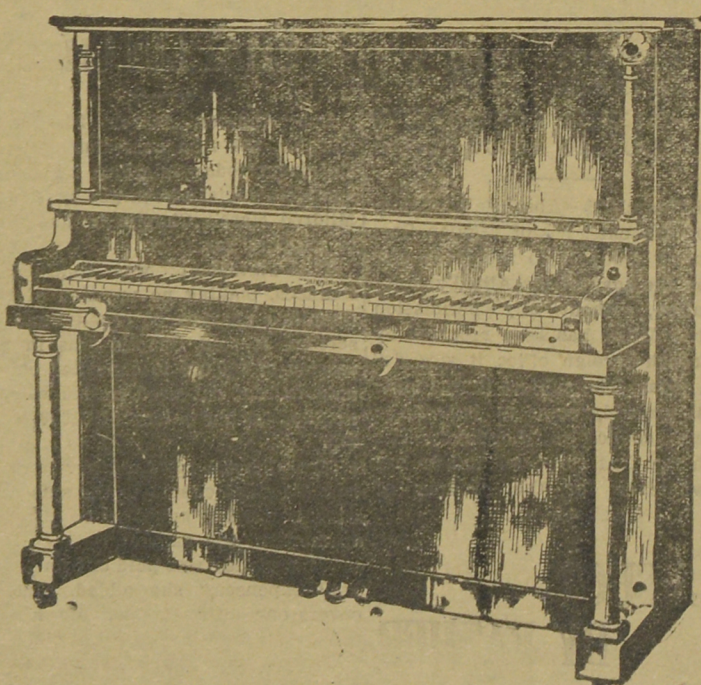
