SUSSEX BEAT LOCAL TEAM IN FAST GAME OF HOCKEY—SCORE 5 TO 6—BIG CROWD SAW GOOD EXHIBITION

Eastern League Brand of Hockey Seems a Trifle Better—Sussex Had Better Defence and Shot Better—Capt. "Tart" Titus of Fredericton Pulled Spectacular Stunt, Almost Scoring After Rush From His Own Net.

Sussex defeated the Fredericton team with three Marysville players as substitutes, 5 to 3 at the Arctic Rink Monday night. The game which was an exhibition was probably the best of the season from the spectator's viewpoint and gave some basis of comparison between Eastern League hockey and that of the New Brunswick League. The Eastern variety seems to have a little on that played at the other end of the province.

Public interest in hockey does not seem to flag and another big crowd turned out last night. All were pleased with the brand of hockey played but of course would have liked to see Fredericton on the big end of the score.

Goalkeeper Almost Scored

One of the most unusual features of any hockey match was seen within a few minutes of the close of the game when Titus the Fredericton goalkeeper and captain took the puck from a shot on his own net and went up the ice with it. He carried close in on the Sussex goal and passed to his centre, Wade, whose shot was blocked and then shot from the rebound almost scoring. The play brought the crowd up yelling.

Sussex Defence Was Good

Sussex had the superior defence. In the net Finegan like Titus played a magnificent game and seemed to have the better of the breaks of luck. Hay and P. Radcliffe were better than the Fredericton defence keeping the local forwards off the net. LeClair who is an oldtimer as hockey goes, spent much of his time with the penalty timers as he persistently loafed off-side and Referee Staples was strict. Friars and H. Radcliffe did the scoring for their team and were a pair of fast wings. Roach was the only Sussex sub and although not classing with the rest of the team worked in well. In weight Sussex had a big advantage and used it.

Fredericton Shooting Poor

The Fredericton team in general did not shoot well. Lounsbury late in the game tried his long shot from the side which was very effective early in the season. He scored once. Had Fredericton resorted more to this the score might have been different. He played a good game at all times. Burgess was the most popular player on the ice with the possible exception of Edgar Wade. He showed great speed but his lack of weight was a tremendous handicap. Often he was sent spinning by the heavier Sussex players. Several times he was able to circle the Sussex net. Colwell fitted in well in the rushes but was not shooting in any form. The same seemed to be true of Irvine Wade who was played in the same position. Jewett and Jarvis as a defence were not as effective as Hay and P. Radcliffe, although making some good rushes. Jewett's stick-handling was pretty good at times. The three Marysville men who were substituted, were a great strength to the team but were not in as good form as they have been this season. Fredericton's weakness all season has been lack of subs. The Marysville players accounted for two of the local team's goals.

Sussex Held the Lead

Friars tallied the first for Sussex the shot-going in off Jewett's skate. It was a piece of hard luck for the locals. LeClair soon afterward got in some good stick-handling and took the rubber to the Fredericton end but was driven into a corner. All the Fredericton subs were put in early and there was no further scoring.

Fredericton started the second period with a fierce attack. The Sussex defence was impenetrable and Fredericton soon was defending. Titus was playing in great form. The fine shooting of the Sussex forwards was observable. H. Radcliffe finally put one in. Fredericton looked shaky and Sussex kept them defending. Friars scored the third in two minutes. The local team then took a new lease of life and Jewett went through all alone on a fine rush and shot. Finegan stopped but Irvine Wade beat him out on the rebound. Fredericton showed a reversal of form and went after the leaders. In two minutes Edgar Wade made the score 3 to 2 with a pretty side shot.

The final period began with Sussex working hard to increase the lead. Titus saved again and again but H. Radcliffe finally beat him out after a

long dodging rush by himself. The local fans were delighted when Lounsbury after Fredericton had attacked several times without a score, drove in a long one from the side, much as had E. Wade. The visitors had but one goal to the good and it looked good for a tie but Fredericton could not put the necessary punch into it.

With two minutes to play H. Radcliffe made another. It was right after that that "Tart" Titus made his spectacular play in a final attempt to score. Time was called soon afterward.

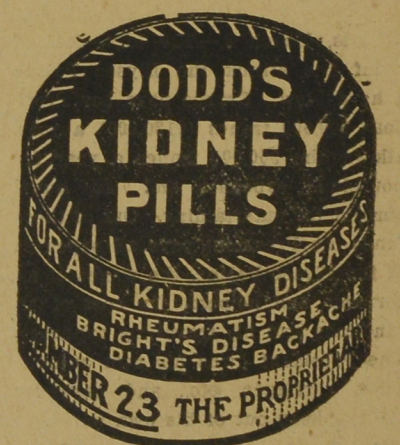

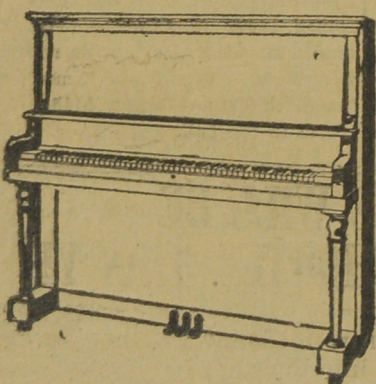
