## BRITISH RUGBY IN TORONTO HAS BIG FOLLOWING

Four-Team League Playing a Spring Series of Matches—Crowds Like Style of Game.

Toronto Scottish and Toronto Welsh won the opening games in the British Rugby League at Trinity College grounds. Scottish outplayed Toronto Irish by a good margin and beat them 6 to 0, while West of England lost to the Welsh team in a well played game by 5 to 3.

The large crowd which attended was agreeably surprised by the good form displayed by all the teams. The latter have not had sufficient time to perfect their plays but everything considered they gave an interesting exhibition.

In the opening game between West of England and Toronto Welsh the latter won the toss and decided to play with the wind at their backs. They immediately assumed the attack but the English backs relieved and rushed the ball up the field, where the Welsh being penalized the West scored a penalty goal. Shortly afterwards the Welsh scored a try and half time found them leading by 5 to 3.

The second half was very evenly contested, both sides getting in some pretty passing movements, all of which were broken up by vigorous tackling. The forwards, too, made strenuous efforts to take the ball over the lines, but no further score resulted.

The Irish won the toss in the second game, but their victories stopped right there. Scottish scoring a try in each half and winning 6 to 0.

The Scottish line was many times in danger, but good tackling saved them. The Scottish forwards, settled down to healing and gave their backs many opportunities to score, but each Scottish attack was broken up by the spoiling defence of the Irish backs.

## CARPENTIER IN MOVIE K. O.

New York, April 29—Georges Carpentier scored a knockout in the pictures. Fighting in white tights and a blue belt, the hardy Frenchman appeared in the ring of the Solar Studio in Fort Lee, N. J. For four rounds his gloves played against his opponent's like a darting rapier and then—entirely according to schedule—the opponent was dropped with a few of Carpentier's choicest blows.

More than 1,500 persons saw the bout. Among them were Major-General Robert L. Bullard, U. S. A., commander of the Eastern Department; John Drew, Jimmie Wilde, the English featherweight and Mayor Frank Hague, of Jersey City. It was Carpentier's first appearance in the ring since he came to this country. The picture will be a Cole-Sobertson production, directed by John G. Adolfi.
