Big Cotton Mill Strike

Many former Canadians will be affected by a general strike in eighteen cotton and yarn mills in New Bedford which will go into effect on Monday. All the mills in New Bedford, except the Nashawena, Passaic and Beacon, will be shut down, eleven of the thir-teen textile unions having voted for a strike in support of the loom-fixers who have been out a week or more. The unions also voted to demand an advance in wages of fifty per cent. as soon as the loom-fixers difficulty is adjusted. The strike order affects more than 20,000 operatives.
