## HOLLANDS MAY BUY THE RED SOX CLUB

H. H. Frazee Ready to Make Transfer—One Million Dollars Mentioned as the Probable Figure.

Boston, March 4—The Boston American League baseball club may be sold. A conference between Harry H. Frazee, present owner and John F. and Daniel E. Holland of the Holland brothers is scheduled.

Mr. Frazee came over from New York and said there was nothing new in connection with the Red Sox. He declared that the action brought by former owner Joseph J. Lannin would be settled amicably, after which he might have something to say. Just what this is he did not state, but it is known that John F. Holland is to talk with him.

The Holland brothers, originators of the chain of liquor stores known as the Holland system, have been approached many times on the matter of buying the Red Sox. Hugh A. McBrean, ex-secretary of the Red Sox, and Thomas Barry have discussed it with the Hollands. Daniel E. Holland said last night that there are many angles to the proposition, but that something might develop as a result of the conference.

Mr. Holland said that McBrean has been acting as middle man. "Not until we have had a talk can we say anything as to really purchasing the club," he added.

The sale of the Red Sox may also include Fenway Park, for a total of \$1,000,000. The report has it that the deal has to do with the transfer of the Frazee holdings in the Red Sox to the Holland interests. Frazee said that \$1,000,000 could not buy the club and that not until someone offered real money and actually talked business would the club be disposed of.

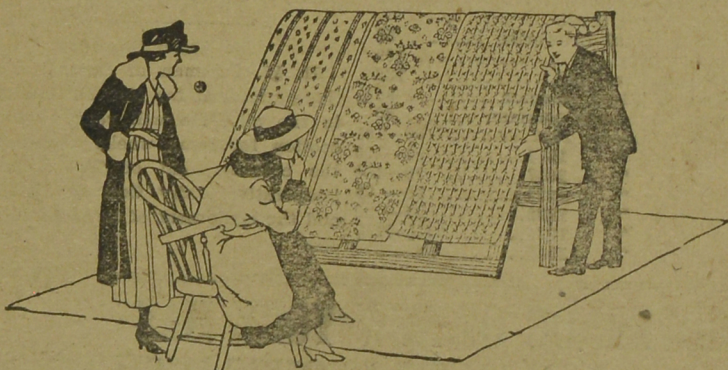
