COLD WEATHER SPELLS DEATH TO LIVE STOCK

Thousands of Cattle and Horses Starving on the Prairies—
Untimely Blizzard Causes the Death of Many—Winter's Return was Prophesied by "Probs" of the Pacific Coast—
Floods are Now Feared.

Calgary, April 9—Almost am I persuaded to believe, as do most Westerners, in "Foster," the weather man of the Pacific Coast, whose bulletins forecasting climatic conditions are a feature of Western news services, and by whose prognostications thousands of farmers in the Prairie Provinces profess to be guided. Foster in a bulletin now many day sold, prophesied that the country would suffer from a "cold wave" that would prevail until about the middle of April. I saw the dire news while on my way westward, but entirely disregarded it for hundreds of minor prophets whom I encountered declared that the long, cold winter could mean but one thing: rapid disappearance of snow and exceptionally mild weather in April.

Those minor prophets probably have retreated into igloos along the northern edge of Superior; at any rate, Foster has the field on the prairies and is quite justified in assuming the I-told-you-so attitude if he so desires.

Fear Floods

All of which by way of introduction to the fact that it still snows in Calgary. On the hundred-mile trip to Trochu a couple of days ago I saw nothing but snow covered prairie; in places "the beautiful" appeared to be quite two feet in depth, and the only means of conveyance seen on the trails were sleighs. During most of the present week precipitation has been general throughout the West, and the result is an accumulation of snow vastly in excess of that seen at almost any date in previous winters, and for this late date almost a record breaker in a period of over thirty years. It is quite probable that should very mild weather suddenly ensue heavy floods will occur at many points on the prairies.

There is a serious aspect to it all, as I have repeatedly shown in former letters. The winter-long scarcity of fodder was a great misfortune in itself, but the prolongation of winter is nothing more nor less than a seal on the death warrant of thousands of cattle and horses. This I state with some hesitation, but absolutely without reservation. No good service is


