# SECRET COUNCIL ORDERS CRIMES OF SINN FEIN

Inner Organization of the Nationalist Party Directs the Policy of Terrorism Now Prevailing in Ireland—Life and Death Powers are Usurped—Responsible for Murders Charged to Police—Assassinations for Treachery.

(Toronto Globe Correspondence)

London, May 14—The secret constitution of the Irish Republican Brotherhood the backbone and directing force of the Sinn Fein revolutionary movement in Ireland, has come into possession of your correspondent. This document establishes for the first time the existence of a Supreme Council or Inner Circle of Sinn Feiners, headed by Eamonn de Valera, which has complete power to declare war, levy taxes, demand tribute and hold secret courts-martial, and is, in fact as well as right, the sole Government of the Irish Republic.

## Power of Life and Death

For years this constitution has been known only to the most trusted Sinn Fein leaders. A copy was obtained only a short time ago in Ireland, and its authenticity cannot be questioned. Although the British Government has suspected the existence of an inner circle of revolutionists, with supreme power over the acts and lives of members of the Irish Republican Brotherhood it has not known until recently how this council was selected, who presided over it and how extensive was its control of the Sinn Fein movement.

Now the authorities possess this most confidential document of the Sinn Feiners, and know where the responsibility rests for Irish rebellions for attacks on police barracks for assassinations of policemen and for the execution of apparently innocent Irishmen, and it is expected that with this information, the British Government will be in a position to deal more effectively with the anarchy which exists in Ireland today.

The most important clauses of constitution show that, contrary to the statements of the Sinn Fein leaders, the supreme power in Ireland today is not vested in the Dail Eireann or the Irish Sinn Fein Parliament elected in 1918, but in a Secret Inner Council, and that every one of the hundred thousand men of the Irish Republican Volunteers and the members of the brotherhood are sworn to secrecy and to "true Allegiance to the Supreme Council." How much the Sinn Feiners valued the secrecy of the Inner Council and the Irish Republican Brotherhood is indicated by the severe punishment inflicted upon anyone who even spoke of the brotherhood except in secret meeting.

The significance and importance of the finding of this constitution are evident when the nature of the present civil war in Ireland is understood. For some months past many apparently innocent Irishmen have been murdered and their deaths have been charged to the police. What actually has happened in many cases is that those Irishmen have been suspected of betraying the secrets of the brotherhood and the Supreme Council to the British authorities, and the Inner Circle has court-martialed them and countenanced their execution.

Ruling by Terror  
For instance, on one occasion a lo-

cal meeting took place in a large Irish city. One of the members was under suspicion by his colleagues, so those who trusted on another called a meeting and discussed the storage of arms in a certain house. Next day that house was raided. Nothing was found but on the following day an Irishman whom everyone thought was innocent of all political intrigue was found murdered. His murder was charged to the police, although the police had nothing to do with it. In that effective but silent manner the Inner Supreme Council of the Republican Brotherhood has been ruling Ireland.

It is extremely doubtful whether the existence of the constitution and the autocratic powers which it confers upon fifteen men known to very many Irishmen or Irish sympathizers. Although the constitution expressly states that de Valera, as President of the Republic is President of the Supreme Council, his presence in America has naturally absolved him from direct implication in the recent secret sessions of the Supreme Council.

## SOUTHAMPTON.

Southampton, May 14—The mortal remains of Mrs. Wilmot Mooers were laid to rest on Friday May 7th at Southampton. Her death which was sudden and unexpected has created deep and pathetic feeling throughout the community. She was a woman of splendid disposition and is remembered as a bride of only two years ago. She and her husband with their adopted niece little Violet May lived in perfect happiness and concord. Up to the Saturday before her death no one had any apprehension of the adverse happening. Sunday however developments were not favorable and as a result of a special consultation of the doctors an operation was decided on. Mrs. Mooers was conveyed by special train to Fredericton and without delay the operation was successfully performed. Mr. Mooers was with his wife and so were her father and mother, Mr. and Mrs. John Cullerton although regrets were felt that their first born baby boy had not been saved yet all felt gratified at the thought of Mrs. Mooers survival and had high hopes of her speedy recovery. Their hopes however were not to be realized, for notwithstanding all that money and human effort and skill could do the precious life ebbed away. The deceased was in her 22nd year. The funeral was one of the largest we have witnessed. The spacious New Church being unable to accommodate all the mourners and sympathizers. The arrangements which were in the hands of Mr. Willis Trail were efficiently carried out. The service was conducted by the Rev. Mr. Bell and the Rev. Mr. Rutledge. The floral contributions were as follows:

## EXPLODING CANNON BALL INJURES FOUR

Newport, R. L., May 13—A cannon ball kept at the Naval Torpedo Station as a relic of other days, was dropped into a forge today. The forge was wrecked and four civilians were injured slightly by the explosion which followed. The emergency crew of the station prevented a fire.

The ball was dropped into the fire by a civilian crew in charge of F. Harvey, a boilermaker, for annealing in the belief that it was solid. The heat reached the explosive inside within a minute and the ball was torn to bits, pieces of the shell striking the civilians near the forge.

James R. Heffernan, George Cleary and Harvey escaped with torn faces and arms, but John J. Gleason suffered injuries to his eyes, which caused him to be taken to the hospital.
