Education and Teachers' Salaries


Education, one of the greatest of the public services has suffered more from changed conditions arising out of the war than any other. The salar-jes of teachers a few years ago were not sufficient to live upon and in order to prevent wholesale desertion of teachers from educational services, a committee was appointed by the leg-islature to investigate and report. The result was an act increasing the gov ernment grant and salaries of teach ers making it possible for the poore attractive to our young people and enable the youth of the country to receive that instruction which is abso-

lhtely necessary for the well being and prosperity of any province . Vocational education has been given a great impetus by the appoint ment of a Vocational Board which taking advantage of the assistance given by the federal government in co operation with the provincial author ities, is establishing schools in different centres of the province, thus giv ing an opportunity to many ambitious young men and women to obtain such industrial education as will better fit them for the battle of life.

Water Power Development

The development of the water poy ers of New Brunswick is a part of the policy of this government and I con-sider it necessary to receive the approval of the electorate for the large expenditure involved for this purpose before it is finally undertaken. Our water powers are part of the provin-cial wealth and when they are develop ed this country will be enriched, for power stimulates progress and much tries, much employment and much production. 
