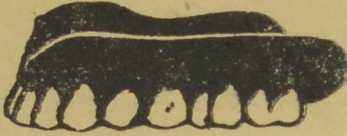
In this way it is hoped to give the form of Liberal representation to the maritime provinces and thus justify to some extent the name of the new party. It is believed that Mr. Spinney could have had a portfolio if he had felt he could be elected again in Yarmouth and Clare. There is, however, a large Liberal vote, much of it French-Canadian, in this riding and as a Meighen minister seeking re-election Hon. Mr. Spinney would not stand much chance. There was some surprise at Hon. Mr. McCurdy being given at once so important a portfolio as minister of public works but he has been an energetic and enterprising business man and though not much of an organizer and executive that the new premier felt the choice to be justifiable. There was the additional inducement that a minister with an important portfolio may carry more prestige with his constituents when he comes back to seek re-election. It is also not improbable that Hon. Mr. McCurdy asked for a "man's job" if any and for a free hand because he has resigned governmental positions before now as a protest against dawdling and incompetency. He had been appointed in February, 1918 parliamentary secretary of the newly formed department of the soldiers' re-establishment and chairman of the invalided soldiers' commission, resigning both in November, 1918.

ell's work also as minister of health a department which sooner or later, will be merged with immigration and colonization with which it has much to do in some places.

Sir James Loughheed, minister of soldiers' civil re-establishment and government leader in the senate, has become minister of the interior.

The department of soldiers' civil re-establishment is being left vacant for the time but it is understood that Sir James will remain acting minister for the time being although as the work becomes less it may be merged in the department of militia.

Sir Edward Kemp

Sir Edward Kemp member for Toronto East, and until Saturday minister of overseas military forces from Canada in the United Kingdom now declines from that paid portfolio and is now without the ten thousand dollars a year which the other ministers get.

Aside from these and the position of Hon. Arthur Meighen as prime minister and secretary of state for external affairs there are no changes.

For the time being Hon. Hugh Guthrie will continue to act as solicitor general as well as minister of militia and the new premier having surmounted the first hill can rest a while before starting another climb.

It was about 12.30 p.m. when the old Borden ministers came out of the council room and moved in a straggling group through the halls of the east block to the governor general's office to be sworn in. There were eight of them Hon. Meighen, Foster, Guthrie, Loughheed, Calder, Sifton, Drayton, Reid and Robertson, and a little later F. B. McCurdy followed. They were accompanied by the new premier and Hon. Martin Burrell, the new parliamentary librarian, who thus saw his old colleagues bend their necks to the old yokes from which he now is free. Sir Robert Borden dropped in once or twice during the half hour when the "cussing in" was going on as some ribald civil servants called it. He still has work to do about his old office.

"I feel that I should be away from this," he said laughingly this morning. "I understand how Charles II must have felt when on his death bed he apologized to those around him for taking such an unconscionably long time in dying."

Later in the afternoon E. K. Spinney was sworn in and Hon. Rupert W. Wigmore as well as Hon. C. J. Doherty. Mr. Ballantyne was sworn in last Saturday. Hon. Mr. Kemp and Dr. Tolmie can be sworn in at any time by the clerk of the Privy Council without the necessity of the attendance of the governor-general as they are privy councillors.

It is understood that the premier decided that with changes in the law it would be necessary to have recourse to the "double shuffle" and that present ministers need not go back to their constituencies for re-election in any case.
