Thirty Will Enter.

Final authority has been received from Ottawa in regard to the school teachers and cadet instructors' course which will be held at the St. John Armories commencing July 19 and end-ing August 18. The courses of train-ing will be similar to those of a lieutenant of the active militia, with the ad dition of physical training and sema-phore signalling. About thirty persons are expeced to take the course. Those who successfully pass examinations will get a certificate as a qualified school cadet instructor, and will be eligible to appointment as officers and as school cadet instructors, which they may hold as long as they act as cadet corps instructors. Upon refire-ment they may be transferred to the eserve of officers for a period of five years.
