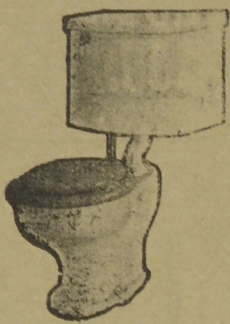

SATISFIED WITH THE SHAMROCK

City Island, N. Y. May 20—Charles B. Nicholson British designer of the Shamrock IV, who arrived from England on the Mauretania had his first thorough inspection here today on the yacht with which Sir Thomas Lipton hopes to win the American cup off Sandy Hook in July.

At the end of the inspection Nicholson stated he was satisfied with the way his plans had been carried out. "If I were designing a cup boat today," he went on to say, "undoubtedly she would be different from the Shamrock IV. It is six years since the craft was built. We have learned a great deal since then, principally because aviation has given us a lot of valuable data."

Even were the work on the Shamrock IV finished, it would be impossible to launch the craft before the end of the week.

The Vanitie, which starts racing the Resolute off New Haven this week for the honor of defending the American cup was hauled out here for her final cleaning. The American yacht is lying directly in front of the cup challenger, and until she is again put into the water it would be impossible to launch the Lipton yacht.

It is expected that the Vanitie will be out of the water until Thursday. She will then be taken to New Haven.

of the House is undoubtedly a severe handicap, but with more experience that trouble will disappear.

Some Comparisons

Allowing for the difference in numbers I think the New Brunswick Legislature will compare very favorably with that of Ontario. Premier Drury is a capable leader and seems to possess a good share of sound common sense, but Premier Foster will not suffer from a comparison with him.

There are some good speakers in the Ontario House, but none whom I listened to can hold a candle to Hon. P. J. Veniot, and I don't believe there are any who as parliamentarians will rank with Hon. C. W. Robinson or Dr. Baxter. The Ontario members are paid \$1500 a session and they recently made an unsuccessful effort to have it increased to \$2500. If they are underpaid at \$1500, I do not think that any fair minded person who after having watched the conduct of proceedings in both Houses could very well say with truth that the members of the New Brunswick House are over paid with an indemnity of \$1000.
