OSCAR VITT
HAS SIGNED

Boston, April 26—Infielder Oscar Vitt of the Red Sox who failed to reach an agreement with the management on the salary question and so has been a holdout all the Spring, has accepted terms, and will report to the Boston club in New York.

Vitt has been on the Pacific Coast all Winter. He was one of the stars who was not signed last Fall. There has been considerable dickerings since New Year's with no result and just before the opening of the season Manager Barrow announced his willingness to trade Vitt to the Yankees for Pratt and Ping Bodie. Miller Huggins could not see his way clear to make the exchange.

Upon the opening of the championship season last week, the Boston club announced the suspension of both Vitt and Schang, who also is out because of a disagreement on salary but Schang had already signed a contract.

The club announces that Vitt will be carried as a utility infielder, which would indicate that Manager Barrow proposes to string along with Foster at third base and McNally at second. The chances are that Vitt will be traded if a player of two worth while can be obtained in exchange.

New York, April 26—The injury to the immortal "Three-fingered" Brown of the Cubs of other days are recalled by the addition to the pitching staff of the St. Louis American League club of a youngster named Bill Burwell, who has a mutilated finger on his right hand. Bill was a dough-boy in France, and the injury to his hand is a memento of the war, for the finger got in the way of a stray bullet from a German machine gun one day.

Bill avers that was quite the most fortunate incident in his life, for before the war he never was much of a pitcher, but now, chiefly because of his crooked and shattered finger, he can get a peculiar grip on a ball and make it do all sorts of stunts.

In an Olympic games year it is interesting to learn what athletes or other countries are doing. H. E. Wilson of New Zealand is a hurdler who will bear watching and also a sprinter of class. G. Davidson of Auckland beat him a yard in the 100-yard dash in the New Zealand championships on Jan. 20 in 9 4-5c. Wilson, however, won the 120-yard high hurdles in 1:35 and one watch recorded 14 4-5 c; but it is stated that there was a two-foot drop to the track.

The Australasian championships took place at Sydney, N. S. W., on Jan. 31 and Feb. 7. Evidently Davidson did not compete, as Walter W. Hunt (N. S. W.) won the "100" in 10s flat and the "220" in 22 2-5s. Wilson won the 120-yard hurdles in 1:59.10s. There were no other performances of special merit.

DETECTIVES
WERE HELD UP

New York, April 26—Five masked gunmen held up two police detectives and fourteen prisoners they had captured in a raid on a card game in a Harlem apartment today and in escaping after the detectives opened fire, one of the bandits shot and mortally wounded Herbert Hayes, a negro elevator operator. Hayes died later in a hospital. The gunmen escaped in an automobile.

Shortly before this incident five masked men believed to be the same men, held up another card game in Harlem and escaped with \$1,000.

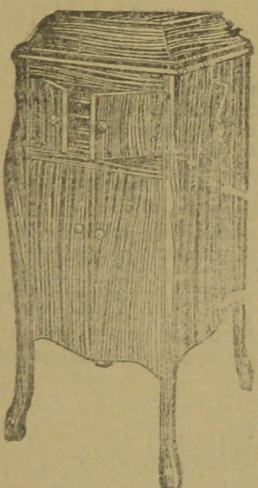
