## A MACHINE THAT REVEALS LATE HOURS

(New York Sun)

Even the best tonsorial pick-me-up will be powerless to deceive the boss into thinking that a member of his staff who spent all night at a poker game has a bright-eyed, willing feeling when he comes to work if a cruel little invention which has been put to use in England becomes a part of this Country's industrial equipment.

This machine has an iron frame in which there is a slit. Behind this opening a roll of paper constantly unwinds. The paper is covered with black dots, and the person who is undergoing a test for concentration sits back of this small machine and with a sharp stick tries to pierce the black dots. The object is to find out how fast this person can prick dots.

When the most rapid rate with which he can get away with the dots has been ascertained it is easy to discover how far he is below par on any one morning.

The boss has only to put him down at the machine to find out just about what time he got home the night before.

If he has been up until 1 o'clock, careful experimentation has shown, it will take him three days before he can pierce as many dots as on the days when he has gone to bed early the night before, say at about 8.30 o'clock or 9.

If he stays up until 1 o'clock three nights in succession it will take him three weeks to get back to his usual dotting average.

Dr. Winifred Cullis, professor of physiology at the London School of Medicine the largest woman's medical college in the world, told the Women's Medical Society of New York State all about the devastating dot machine at their annual meeting at the McAlpin yesterday. Dr. Cullis was one of the two women members on the joint committee of the board of industrial and scientific research and the board of medical research which investigated the subject of fatigue and similar problems of industry in Great Britain during the war.

A method of measuring fatigue accurately has been difficult to find, according to Dr. Cullis, and the dot machine is one of many devices that have been tried. Persons who are fatigued cannot concentrate, and therefore are unable to prick many dots, as this requires a high degree of concentration.

Very few persons are fatigued from work in England today. Dr. Cullis believes. In the factories that have been investigated it has been found there is no falling off on one Monday morning from the output of the previous Monday morning which cannot be traced to some other cause than overwork. The periods of recreation therefore, are sufficient for the complete recovery of the body from its labors. The fatigue tests which are used at the beginning of the day, after the luncheon hour and again at night often are influenced by unfortunate external circumstances. In one case a young working woman whose tests had been remarkably advantageous because of the regularity of the rise and fall of the curve of her output suddenly became extremely erratic in registering to the fatigue scale. This might have constituted a serious contribution to science if it had not been found that the young woman had a beau and that she was perfectly conscious that he was waiting for her outside.

It was necessary to eliminate the young woman entirely from the scientific world and abandon her to the realm of her emotions.

An extremely interesting fatigue experiment was made on dockers who were tested at the beginning of the day

and at the end to find the amount of fatigue. After severe tests it was discovered that the men who worked on piecework were just about twice as fatigued as those who worked on time. The latter showed almost no fatigue whatever.

Dr. Eliza M. Mosher of Brooklyn recommended those present to drink a glass of water at 10 in the morning and a glass at 3, at 4 and at 5 o'clock in the afternoon to keep from becoming fatigued. The water, she said, would dilute the fatigue products which were entering the blood.
