- Grated rind of elmon. 2 tablespoon's lemon juice,
- 2-3 cup sugar.
- 1-3 cup corn syrup,
- 1 egg yolk, 1 tablespoon metled butter substitute.
- 2 tablespoons corn flour.
- 1/4 cup hot water,
- 2 apples, pared and grated. 1 egg white.

Mix grated rind of lemon, lemon juice, sugar. corn syrup, egg yolk slightly beaten, melted butter substitute corn flour and hot water. Then add apples which have been pared and grated. When well mixed fold in stiffly beaten egg white. Line pie plates with pastry, fill with lemon mixture, cover with pastry and bake.


