On the south bank of the River Lee the Carnegie library, the corn exchange city hall and other buildings were razed by the fire, while in the territory between the northern and southern branches of the river much avoc was wrought by flames in the usiness section.

Late this evening it was reported that the fire was under control but it vas said that the damage done by the flames was estimated at between £2,-00,000 and £8,000,000 sterling.

The conflagration followed an amoush of the military at Pillon's cross Saturday night in which four persons were killed and many wounded.

Three civilians were taken from their houses and shot dead after the ambush of the military. Then the fires started. There were bomb explosions and firing also was heard. The populace was panic-stricken. The dames were so hot at places that tram ars have been set on fire

Loss Nearly \$10,000,000

Dublin, Dec. 12-Several blocks of ulldings in the heart of the business district of Cork were destroyed by fire during the night, constituting the costliest destruction of property since he reprisals began in Ireland. A group of public buildings on Albert quay, in cluding the city hall, the Carnegie library and a portion of the corn exchange were also burned, as well as private residences in various parts of he city.

The fires extended to St., Patrick street, from Cork street to Maylor street and swept entire rows of build ings on both sides of Winthrop street leading from St. Patrick street to Old Georges street. It was reported from Cork vesterday afternoon that newly arrived parties of auxiliaries were ambushed within half a unit of racks, twelve of them being wounded Qneen.

At 4 o'clock this afternoon people were just beginning to venture again in the streets; the whole city was then in control of the military, and it is understood that the officer in com-
